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### Iconic traditional healer laid to rest



Internationally renowned traditional healer, Professor Conrad Tsiane, who died after a short illness, was laid to rest on Saturday 9 October at Klopper Village in Moutse West, Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality.

Tsiane died on 30 September at the age of 59. He was also a businessman and politician who served as Mayor of Moutse TLC and speaker of Greater Marble Hall Municipality, later known as Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality.

His funeral service was attended by Minister of Basic Education Angie Motshekga, MEC for Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure Namane Dickson Masemola, the Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality Cllr Stanley Ramaila and traditional healers from different parts of the country. He was described as a selfless leader who will be remembered with his marvellous knowledge of African medicine, dating back from 1987 when he started working as traditional health practitioner.

Born on 13 June 1962 at Ga-Seleka Village, in Waterberg District, Limpopo Province, Tsiane was also an academic who was conferred with different qualifications from various institutions. In August 2020, The Los Angeles University honoured Professor Tsiane with a Masters' Degree in Entrepreneurship, Doctoral Degree in in Cultural Communications and a Prof Degree in African Medicine and Philosophy. The LA University honoured Tsiane in a highly esteemed graduation ceremony attended by Basic Education Minister Angie Motshekga, American delegate, traditional leaders, tra-

ditional healers, professors, doctors, various government departments' representatives and community members. Earlier this year, Tsiane revealed to the Dispatch that he was going to receive another doctoral degree from one of the universities in the country."The plan is still in the pipeline and more information about the name of the university, faculty and qualification will be divulged once the agreement is sealed. What I can say is that it is a degree in relation to indigenous medicine," he said at the time. Unfortunately, he passed away just before he can receive the degree from that university. The iconic Professor Tsiane was the founder of Mpelege Scholarship Trust that has already produced a number of graduates from his community. He served as leader of ANC in Sekhukhune Region and has participated in the amalgamation of Moutse and Hlogotlou Lepelle TLC. Tsiane was also a big supporter of the South African national soccer team and well-known to the South African Football Association (SAFA). He used to travel with BafanaBafana during their important matches even when playing outside the country.

### Minister Mchunu opens upgraded Flag **Boshielo Water Treatment Plant**

The Minister of Water and Sanitation, Senzo Mchunu, unveiled the refurbished Flag Boshielo Water Treatment Plant to deal with the impact of drought in villages of Ephraim Mogale and other neighbouring local municipalities. Accompanied by the Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality Cllr Stanley Ramaila, Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality Mayor Cllr David Mothogoane and Chairperson of Lepelle Northern Water (LNW) Dr Ndweleni Mphephu, Mchunu launched the refurbished plant on Saturday 9 October. The project is one of many water infrastructure projects implemented by the Department of Water and Sanitation to increase the capacity that will meet the demands of the communities it serves. Through its entity, Lepelle Northern Water Board, the Water and Sanitation Department 7 increased the capacity Flag Boshielo Water Treatment Plan from 12 megalitres per day to 20 megalitres. The newly refurbished plant is set to supply water to 156 villages in Ephraim Mogale, Elias Motswaledi, Lepelle-Nkupi and Makhuduthamaga Local Municipalities. The upgraded plant will be beneficial for villages such as Elandskraal, Mbuzini, Moratela, Dichoeung, Tsimanyane, Phethwane, Mafisheng, Letebejane, Mogalatsane, Setlaboswana, kolokotela, Malope, Mphane, Rakgoadi, Mohlotsi, Phokwane, Mabintane, and others. The project created employment for 57 local people and will supply water to 28 185 households  $\Pi$ in various local municipalities of Sekhukhune.

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# Generic vs. Genuine Car Parts - What's the Verdict?

All vehicles need maintenance or repairs at some point in time and the consideration of using genuine or generic car parts is a key consideration. Your car might even need some now without your knowing it. At the more expensive end of these fixes are engine and transmission repairs. #### **Generic Car Parts**

When it comes to parts that aren't made by a vehicle's original manufacturer, you're likely to hear two terms: "generic" and "aftermarket." These technically mean the same thing—parts made by a third party—but have very different connotations. Aftermarket parts are typically thought of as an upgrade, something used to enhance a car's performance beyond market standards; generic parts are simply intended to replace OEM parts and provide acceptable quality. As you're considering replacement part options, it's a good idea to keep this difference in mind

#### The Pros and Cons of Generic Car Parts

The greatest advantage of generic parts, of course, is that they're generally priced lower than OEM parts. You'll probably also get bet-

ter availability and a wider selection — which can be particularly helpful if you're looking to repair an older car for which the manufacturer has stopped making the parts you need. The downside of generic parts is that most countries don't regulate their parts industries, which means it's difficult to judge quality without the brand name to give you some sense of security. Some of these generic parts also won't come with a warranty.

#### The Pros and Cons of Name-Brand Car Parts

The biggest advantage of paying for OEM car parts is that you can rely on the consistency that comes along with a certain brand. When you use Lexus repair parts as part of your Lexus service, you know you'll be getting the highest possible quality. You should keep in mind, however, that auto repair shops sometimes give quotes assuming that you'll want generic parts, and some insurance companies will even require that you pay the difference if you want OEM

parts used in an otherwise covered repair. Car manufacturers are resellers in exactly the same way as independent parts distributors 3 are because the parts they sell come from [ independent component manufacturers. 7 'Genuine parts' seldom if ever carry the real manufacturer's brand mark and as a result, I emanate from an 'unknown' source. As they are supplied by more than one manufacturer, this hides the true origin from those customers Qwho are brand conscious or loyal to products from specific countries for reasons of national pride. It, therefore, appears that according to dictionary definitions the independent parts distributor is actually the seller of "genuine \{ parts" because their parts are branded and clearly identifiable as to both the source and the origin. So in conclusion, OEM parts 1 keep the vehicle closer to its original state. However, on the flip side, once you drive  $\square$ your car off of the lot, it's no longer new. So are OEM parts necessary when used parts 1 or aftermarket parts can get the job done more cost-effectively? You might assume that genuine parts will be of a better quality but this may not always be the case, as 2 aftermarket parts may be reverse engineered so money is saved on development allowing the manufacturer to improve quality at a 👖 lower cost. Genuine parts may differ from OEM parts only in the packaging. Factor in the price difference which can be up to 70% and those non-genuine parts can look pretty  $\square$ appealing. It is important to remember that 2 cheaper parts may not come with a warranty and you should check the terms of your vehicles warranty when getting it serviced. If you're concerned about non genuine parts, you could insist that your garage orders in the genuine parts.

So while the old adage "you get what you pay for" is often true, it could also be said that you pay a lot for a name. While price will determine the decision to some, to others the name will most definitely matter. Ultimately, as a difference in quality cannot be definitively proven, it's up to each person themselves to decide which matters more to them, name or price.

### Suzuki South Africa earns top 3 market position for September 2021

Suzuki South Africa confirms that it has achieved a top three market position for September 2021. The Japanese manufacturer confirms that it has broken its previous record by more than 600 units. In total, 3 134 new vehicle sales were secured.


This is the first time that Suzuki has broken through the 3 000-unit mark in one month. To put it in perspective, the manufacturer set a new record of 1 577 units in July 2019 and broke through the 2 000-unit barrier in 7 October 2020 with a record of 2 032 units. October's sales record did not last long. In February 2021, Suzuki hit a new record of 2 142 units and a month later, in March 2021, it sold 2 397 units. Less than 12 months after selling more than 2 000 units in one month, the brand shot up to over 3 000 units, despite the effects of a global pandemic and local sales disruptions.

"We are ecstatic about the national sales results," says Henno Havenga, manager for auto dealer sales at Suzuki Auto. "Virtually very vehicle we were able to deliver to a dealer found a new owner and dealers report many more customers queueing up for passenger vehicle, SUV or Super Carry commercial vehicle."

With total sales of over 3 000 units, Suzuki now represents 7,2 per cent of the South African market, the company's highest share to date. If one removes the 82 Super Z Carry units sold in September, then the firm represents 10,3 per cent of the passenger vehicle market.

Suzuki sold over 1 200 new vehicles for rental and government fleets as well. This exceeds its previous fleet sales record by ver 50 per cent.

In this month, Suzuki delivered 935 new 7 Swift models and 504 S-Pressos. The Vitara Brezza found 455 new owners while the Fertiga sold 387 units.

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### ROAD TEST: Toyota Starlet vs. Suzuki Baleno

A Cursory glance at these two cars could justifiably have you saying "but they are identical", and you would be right. However, Suzuki's original Baleno has been around since 2015 and with the ink drying on the paperwork for Suzuki-Toyota's alliance only last year, it's safe to assume Toyota had little influence in the design and development of the Starlet. So, what you are looking at is essentially two Balenos.

Platform sharing is nothing new and without it, manufacturers simply wouldn't have the means to develop the vast array of cars offered today. The Lamborghini Huracán and Audi's R8.

The VW Touareg, Audi Q7, Porsche Cayenne, Bentley Bentayga and Lamborghini's Urus. They're all totally different cars but their base architecture is largely the same. With the Starlet and Baleno, however, there are fewer degrees of separation. They are identical, except for their badges and some minor, but important, details which we'll get to shortly.

We've been quite taken with the Baleno in the past. The GL model may have come a close second to the Polo Vivo 1,4 Comfortline in our October 2018 comparative test, but it nonetheless impressed with its nimble road manners and spacious cabin.

It was a similar story when we ran one in our long-term fleet for a full year (June 2018) and covered more than 22 000 km. In the end, we summed it up as having "established itself as a hard-working, budget-beating hatch that can withstand more than you'd expect. An excellent daily commuter."

Now, much the same can be said of the latest inclusion to the stable of Toyota South Africa Motors (TSAM).

Both cars offer a solid driving experience and in true Far Eastern fashion, the engine is happy to be revved to the limit while still serving up sufficient mid-range torque. The gear lever slips easily between the five ratios and if you drive with a careful throttle foot, you'll likely see the average fuel consumption occasionally dipping below the 6,00 L/100 km mark. Just to make

sure, we perfor- mance tested both these cars to see if there were any possible differences between them ... or compared with the Balenos we've tested before. Our Racelogic test equipment indicated the same results between them, as well as from our original Baleno test. The new Baleno and Starlet even came fitted with identical tyres, which explains the consistent braking times we achieved.

Both ride very well and their handling is predictable, with greater front-end grip than we'd expected from an entry-level hatchback. Also keep in mind that for the price, it is a relatively spacious car, both fore and aft. The cabin fittings possess a good level of perceived quality, suggest-ing they'll hold up well to many years of use. In both cars, the touchscreen offers all the basic convenience features, as well as all-important Android Auto and Apple CarPlay connectivity.

At the time of writing the Toyota Starlet 1.4 XR retailed at R269 000, while the Suzuki Baleno 1.4 GLX had a R10 000 advantage with its R259 900 sticker. However, the Toyota

does offer an in-car Wi-Fi hotspot with a complimentary 15 GB package; surely an attractive offering for younger buyers, as is the MyToyota App which enables them to manage certain details about their car. It has to be said, the Starlet's shorter service plan and warranty are less inviting to buyers seeking greater peace of mind compared to the Baleno.

That said, a delve into the parts pricing basket makes for some interesting reading. Although some parts are similarly priced, others are vastly different. In the end, the total parts basket prices are incredibly close, though. All of these minor differences matter little, as Toyota has sold no fewer than 1 102 units during its first full month on the market (October 2020) versus just 51 Suzuki Balenos. We have to wonder why all these buyers haven't been knocking on Suzuki's door. After all, it has offered an identical car for five years. Brand loyalty and Toyota's vast dealership network are the likely reasons.
