





Massive police manhunt launched after internationally renowned artist robbed

The police in Siyabuswa have launched a massive manhunt for a suspect who robbed Dr Esther Nostokana Mahlangu (87), a well-known Ndebele artist from Weltervrede outside Siyabuswa. According to the police report, Mahlangu was on Saturday 19 March robbed of her personal firearm as well as an undisclosed amount of money. "Details of the robbery indicate that on Saturday 19 March around 15:00, the old woman, who was alone at the time was preparing to take a nap where she reportedly locked all doors of her house. Strangely, she noticed a man unknown to her inside the house. The man then allegedly grabbed her and punched her in the face before tying both her hands with a cable and tried to strangle her until she reportedly became unconscious," said Brigadier Selvy Mohlala, Mpumalanga Provincial Police Spokesperson. Mohlala said the elderly Mahlangu reported that she cannot recall what happened thereafter, however, when she regained her conscious, she realized that her house was ransacked and her firearm as well as money were stolen from the safe. "The woman sustained some bruises on her face and the matter was reported to the police at Siyabuswa, whereby a house robbery case was opened hence the manhunt," Mohlala said. He said the suspect is still at large and police urge anyone with information on the whereabouts of the criminal to call the Crime Stop number on 08600 10111, the nearest police station or send information via MYSAPSAPP. "All received information will be treated as confidential and callers may opt to remain anonymous. An investigation regarding the incident is still underway," he said. The Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Mpumalanga, General Semakaleng Daphney Manamela, condemn with strongest terms the armed robbery incident. Manamela further lambasted on the suspects who target elderly people at their places of residence, thereby, robbing them of their personal items, referring to the similar incident occurred on Sunday 20 March where an elderly male pensioner was strangled to death in Delmas. "It is shameful to hear that our senior citizens are now being targeted by heartless criminals who show no mercy at all. This cannot be allowed to continue unabated. The person

be brought to book," she said. Mahlangu is known of her traditional Ndebele technique of wall painting entailed first finishing a house using cow dung. She became the first woman artist to be commissioned to decorate a BMW in traditional Ndebele design. Today, Mahlangu's work is exhibited in Australia, America, Japan and in many European countries.







Three perished in a fatal accident on the N11

Three people have perished in a fatal accident when an articulated truck and a Light Delivery Vehicle (LDV) were involved in a side swipe collision on the N11 Road between Middelburg and Groblersdal near Doornkop. Three other people who were occupants in the LDV sustained critical injuries and were rushed to a nearby hospital in Middelburg. According to

the Mpumalanga Department of Community Safety, Security and Liaison, Moeti Mmusi, the deceased and those who were injured were all occupants of the LDV and the driver of the articulated truck escaped with no injuries. "The LDV had six occupants including the driver while the truck driver was alone. The truck was travelling from the direction of Groblersdal and

the LDV was coming from Doornkop," he said. Mmusi said the cause of the crash is not known at this stage, however, excessive speeding and reckless driving are suspected to have caused the crash. "The investigation to determine the cause of the crash is already underway," he said. The Mpumalanga MEC for Community Safety, Security and Liaison, Vusi Shongwe, has once more urged motorists to use the road

cautiously. He said those who are driving long distances should among other things ensure that they rest sufficiently along the way. "Motorists should obey the rules and always remain alert. They must also adapt their driving to various prevailing conditions on the road," said the MEC. Shongwe has since sent condolences to the bereaved families and also wished those who were injured a speedy recovery.

Fraudster operating in Sekhukhune and Capricorn nabbed

The police have arrested a 26-year-old suspect after he allegedly defrauded unsuspecting customers from Sekhukhune and Capricorn Districts of large amounts of money. According to the police report, the suspect reportedly advertised his business of selling concrete slabs through social media, claiming that he was the owner and CEO of 'MKP Concrete Rib and Block Slab PTY LTD. 'He would request a 50% deposit from his victims before he delivered and then, after receiving the deposit he would disappear," said Brigadier Motlafela Mojapelo, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson. Mojapelo said the suspect was defrauding the community members through social media platforms since 2021 until he was arrested at the Mall of the North in Polokwane recently. "In one of the cases reported in Sekhukhune, the suspect allegedly defrauded his victim an amount of R57 000-00 which was transferred directly into his bank account and failed to deliver the material. The cases were reported at Sekhukhune and Capricorn Districts and other parts of the province where he defrauded the victims an estimated amount of over a million," explained Mojapelo. He said community members across the province are required to come forward and report to the police if they were somehow, defrauded by this suspect. "He will soon appear before the local magistrates court facing charges of fraud. An investigation is still underway," he said. The Acting Provincial Commissioner of the Police Major General Jan Scheepers, has welcomed the arrest of the suspect. Study shows Elias Motsoaledi on the verge of collapse

Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality, is among the 43 municipalities that are on the verge of collapse. This is according to the News24's Out of Order index, calculated from a set of data painstakingly collated over two months. It suggests that the crisis in the frontline of service delivery is likely to deepen. The index is the first data journalism project of its sort in South Africa. A report submitted by Cogta to the parliamentary local government portfolio committee, indicated that a further 111 local municipalities were classified as being at medium risk for deteriorating further. Only 16 were rated as stable. The Out of Order index suggests many of those medium risk municipalities may be further down the road than already imagined. In the recent present, Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality was marred by corruption and maladministration issues levelled against senior officials. This includes their involvement in the unauthorized investment with the liquidated VBS Mutual Bank. The index stated that this is the grim reality in many of South Africa's municipalities, and is the direct result of municipal mismanagement and the prospects for many local governments look bleak. The Index data draws on the most authoritative sources available, such as National Treasury's budget data used to calculate budget allocations to municipalities, the Auditor-General's reports, and Statistics South Africa. In the Index assessment, Elias Motsoaledi was rated as having a serious backlog in employment, poverty elevation and the delivery of basic services including water, houses and electricity to households. According to the Index, even with the data sources being among the most robust available in South Africa, the research identified many problems in the accuracy, reliability and consistency of the data, often in that which is supplied by the municipalities to national government and Statistics SA. However, the Index indicated Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality as one of the municipalities in the country doing well on expenditure in maintaining their infrastructure. This is normally measured as a percentage of the capital budget which is spent on repairs and maintenance, Ideally, R8 in every R100 spent on a capital project, or 8%, should go to maintaining what has been built. Tellingly according to the Index, in the Out of Order data, only four municipalities are spending at that level and they are Cape Town (8%), Ulundi (10.6%), Makhuduthamaga in Limpopo at 17% and Sol Plaatje in the Northern Cape at 8.2%.



R14 Road becoming an eyesore to motorists

Motorists driving on the R14 Road that links Elandsdoorn in Dennilton and Loskop Dam are complaining about hazardous potholes that threaten extreme damages to their vehicles. The motorists claim the road has more potholes that one can count leading to a part of road been reduced to gravel. Bolsheviks Party of South Africa (BPSA) leader, Seun Mogotji, said the road has been made worse by recent heavy rains. Water has damaged the road to the extent that it has caused dongas. Some of these potholes are not clearly visible and it is difficult to spot them when it rains, posing even extreme danger to motorists who pass," he said. Mogotji indicated that senior government officials including the premier, MMCs, mayors and members of parliament are using the road on regular basis when visiting Loskop Dam but they turn a blind eye. "Yet year in and year out, especially during rainfall season, the same problem arises in the area when water is flowing rapidly, whereas, government basic maintenance to attend the matter and construct water drainage system to channel the water when it rains seem to be obliviously neglected. It seems like those who are supposed to be taken responsible for the maintenance of this road think that when it doesn't rain, the status of the road is normal but it is not," he said. Mogotji added that the problem has escalated to Ntwane Village where only a signal alerting motorists about potholes was since placed there a long time ago and the road was never maintained. "To aggravate the situation, a lot of stray livestock are grazing in the area, and with no fencing of the road around Sempupuru, such animals then become a further safety risk to motorist travelling on that road on daily basis," he said. Mogotji said BPSA has written to call for urgent and immediate intervention from the Minister of Public Works, the Premier of Limpopo Province, the MEC of Public Works in Limpopo and the Roads Agency Limpopo (RAL), to take real action on the road.







Chaos over Covid-19 posts in Sekhukhune

Community leaders in Sekhukhune claim that locals have been sidelined in Covid-19 data capturers' appointments available in the Department of Health. The community leaders are pointing fingers to senior officials in the Health Department for giving the positions to their friends and families who resides outside the Sekhukhune District. The leaders said 90% of the appointed personnel, who will be working in all hospitals in Sekhukhune including Dilokong Hospital, Jane Furse Hospital, Philadelphia Hospital, Matlala Hospital, Dilokong Hospital, Groblersdal Hospital, Mecklenburg Hospital and St Rita's Hospital, are coming from other regions in the province. Sekhukhune is one of the regions experiencing a high rate

of unemployment among young people, with many relocating to big cities such as Pretoria and Johannesburg to seek greener pastures. Since the appointments were made, community leaders, accompanied by applicants who are originally from Sekhukhune, visited various hospitals in the area for a head count verification to determine a number of appointed outsiders and Sekhukhune residents in the said positions. The group said it aims to lodge a protracted dispute where is possible where Sekhukhune candidates will be given first priority. Ali Maloba, a community leader from Moutse, said they have learned that most of the candidates who were appointed in the positions were coming from Waterberg and Capricorn

Regions, which is the reason they conducted a head count verification. "This literally means applicants from Sekhukhune did not qualify. We have unemployed sons and daughters of the soil with required qualifications, who have applied for the positions and were deliberately not considered by the Department of Health and the district office," he said. According to Maloba, first priority should have been given to locals as form of job creation for Sekhukhune to deal with high unemployment rate among youth. "We demand that most of the people who are hired in the positions must come from Sekhukhune. Other people must go and dominate the number of employees in their respective regions where they come

from," he said. Limpopo Department of Health Spokesperson, Neil Shikwambana, said the matter is currently receiving attention at their office. "This is a matter we have received in a form of a complaint and we are looking at the veracity of the issue from all angles. Once that is done, we will pronounce ourselves and make our position known on the matter," he said.

MDF to make new submissions to the Demarcation **Board**

The Moutse Demarcation Forum (MDF), is going to submit a new proposal to the Municipal Demarcation Board (MDB), with hopes for the area to return to Mpumalanga Province. The forum says the proposal will be made following $the \, publication \, of \, Circular \, 21, which \, intends \, to \,$ determine the views of residents who mainly resides in the cross boundary municipalities and provinces. MDF was formed just after the area of Moutse was incorporated from Mpumalanga to Limpopo in 2006. The forum has since seeking to return the area back to Mpumalanga Province since then, citing poor services under Limpopo administration. MDF Chairperson, Lucas Kgomo, said the submissions will be made with both MDF and Mpumalanga Party separately. "We will provide a guideline to the demarcation board to propose how we want the area to be re-demarcated," he said. Kgomo said the forum and the party would like Moutse one and Moutse two, which forms part of villages of Moutse West in Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality and Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality to fall under Dr JS Moroka, Moutse two and the part of Sehlakwane area to relocate to the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality. "The submission will be submitted before the MDB board closing date, which is on the 31st March 2022," he said. According to Kgomo, residents of Moutse and Sehlakwane have been living under a serious poor services after the area was incorporated to Limpopo. "There is serious poor service since Limpopo administration took over. Major projects that could have benefiting the community were halted since then including the bulk water purification from Loskop Dam to Moutse. The project was about to be implemented when Limpopo took over and was never materialized until now. Residents are facing a serious draught and are urged to share drinking water with animals," explained Kgomo. He added that the Mpumalanga administration was planning to construct a government office complex around Philadelphia Hospital but the project was also affected after Limpopo took over the area. However, Kgomo said they will make the submission and wait for the municipal demarcation processes so that their concerns will be addressed. "For now, we will be pursuing the government to release the view testing votes through a referendum conducted in 2009 while we are waiting for the outcomes of our proposals," he said.







Sekhukhune Hockey Federation established
