





Jane Furse conjoined twins passed away

The Limpopo Department of Health has confirmed that the conjoined twins, who were successfully delivered at Jane Furse Hospital, passed away in the early hours on Thursday 14 April.

The provincial department said the babies were delivered through a caesarean section and later transferred to Mankweng Hospital Neonatal ICU, for full and further assessment by both neonatologists and pediatric surgeons. Neil Shikwambana, Limpopo Department of Health Spokesperson, said the twins deteriorated overnight and passed on in the early hours of Thursday 14 April. "Since their admission to Mankweng Neonatal ICU, specialists from various clinical disciplines from both Mankweng-Pietersburg Complex and Dr George Mukhari Central Hospital, have been hard at work in pursuit of the best possible intervention for the case. The initial set of studies revealed multiple complexities which required appropriate and thorough planning of further Management," Shikwambana said. The twins were born to a 41-year-old mother at Jane Furse Hospital and were joined at the chest and abdomen. The mother was a patient who was a referral from a clinic and only diagnosed as a normal twin pregnancy during Antenatal

Clinic visits. It was only during the operation that doctors discovered the babies were joined at the chest and abdomen. The MEC for Health

in Limpopo, Dr Phophi Ramathuba, expressed her shock after receiving the sad news. "We were hopeful that the scheduled joint academic meeting between specialists from Mankweng Tertiary Academic and George Mukhari Central Academic Hospital would bring the desired results for the future of the twins. Unfortunately the twins did not make it," she said. Ramathuba has sent her deep seated sympathy's and condolences to the bereaved family and the community at large during this difficult period. The department said a team of Psychologists are dispatched to offer psychological support to the mother of the twins and her family during these hard times.







Executive Mayor acknowledges service delivery backlog

The Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality, Cllr Julia Mathebe, said the district municipality acknowledges that delivery of services is not pleasing in the district. Mathebe said during a State of the District Address (SODA), delivered recently at Ga-Masemola Stadium outside Jane Furse in Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality. "The water service and sanitation infrastructure backlog remains stubborn. Last month, we held a strategic session to assess overall performance of the municipality and to induce fresh ideas to optimize performance," she said. Mathebe said in the session, they had put aside ideological and political differences with a sole purpose of turning the municipality into a leader in the provision of services for the communities. "One thing we all agreed on was that the Infrastructure and Water Services Department is in a 'trauma unit'. What is more concerning is that this is the heartbeat of our municipality. The high employee turnover and the fact that critical positions within the department remain vacant, contributed to the incapacitation of this department," she said. Mathebe said they agreed that they require a dedicated session to dig deeper into the problems that cripple the municipality. However, Mathebe said currently, through the grants, the municipality has completed and implemented several water scheme projects. "Although some of these schemes were delayed over the years, in various instances and phases, parts of them have reached practical completion," she said. Mathebe indicated that the district municipality has successfully completed the Flag Boshielo Water Treatment Plant, which was commissioned in September last year. "The plant was previously only able to purify 8 megalitres of water per day. Its capacity has now been upgraded to purify 20 megalitres, providing water to 156 villages, many of them in the Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality," explained Mathebe. Furthermore, the executive mayor said in October last year, the municipality successfully commissioned and handed over the Jane Furse RDP Package plant project to the community. "The package plant now supplies water through standpipes inside 1000 households at the Jane Furse RDP section. The community of Phaahlamanoge Village was also handed over a water project in October last year," she said. Mathebe said the municipality has noted that the completion of the Moutse Bulk Water Scheme is also long overdue. "It was also delayed by a contractual dispute that was before court. However, the municipality and the consultant ultimately found each other, and work has resumed. Practical completion of the overall project is at 90 percent," stated Mathebe. She said much of the infrastructure construction, including the command and service reservoirs and bulk pipelines in many villages of Moutse has been completed. "Bulk pipeline projects connecting Bloempoort Village and Lusaka Reservoir is at 100 percent. Similar projects from Lusaka Village to Mpheleng Village and from Mpheleng Village to Matlala Lehwelere Village are at 100 percent. In villages such as Matlala Ramoshebo, Matlerekeng/Rathoke and Spitspunt, we are at over 84 percent and in some areas at 88 percent," she said. The executive mayor said upgrading of the Groblersdal Water Treatment Plant, from 18 megalitres to 34 megalitres capacity stands at 95 percent. She said the Groblersdal Water Treatment Plant will supply purified water to the Moutse bulk line.

Free e-learning devices for learners and teachers

MEC for Education in Mpumalanga, Bonakele Majuba, has on Tuesday 19 April, rolled-out the Ubuhlebuzile e-learning programme at Pungutsha Secondary School in Nokaneng outside Siyabuswa. The programme has unfolded in the province earlier this month, in line with the provincial deployment and delivery of 6700 teacher laptops and 55 000 learner tablets, pre-loaded with software, e-Content and data ready for offline use. The devices are handed to Grade 12 learners in quintiles 1, 2 and 3 schools throughout the Mpumalanga Province. According to the department, each Grade 12 learner will also receive free data every month to enable easy access to the education e-content. Jasper Zwane, Mpumalanga Department of Education Spokesperson, said the programme intends to revolutionize the delivery of education in the province and to improve the teaching and learning process to the contemporary 21st century standard. Zwane indicated that the department has planned that by the end of April 2022, 55 000 learners and 6700 teachers will have received these devices intended to help to improve teaching and learning throughout the province. "In the past three weeks, deliveries were made in schools in the Gert Sibande and Bohlabela Districts. This week almost all secondary schools in Nkangala and Ehlanzeni Districts will benefit from this progressive initiative," he said. A total of 110 grade 12 learners and eight teachers from Pungutsha Secondary School benefited from the programme. The hand-over of the devices was graced by the Executive Mayor of the Dr JS Moroka Local Municipality, Cllr Nomsa Mtsweni. After the pep talk, all learners pledged to do their best to pass the grade, promising a 100% pass. The programme proceeded to Seabe Secondary School in the same area to benefit learners and teachers, wherein, the beneficiaries were equally on cloud nine as they received their tablets and laptops. MEC Majuba said he is pleased that the province has reached a major milestone and a step towards reaching higher heights in enriching the potential of each learner. "Now that the learners received these educational resources, it is expected that they will still rise to the occasion and register results which will be above the normal threshold," he said.

Clients owe Sekhukhune Municipality over R300 Million

According to the Sekhukhune District Municipality debt book, by the end of March 2022, the district municipality was owed R329 Million by its clients, for water and sanitation services. This was revealed by the Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality Cllr Julia Mathebe, during a State of the District Address, held at Ga-Masemola Stadium recently. "Since democracy, the government has provided free basic services, including water and electricity to poor households, in areas where infrastructure is available. Even though government had good intentions with this policy, some of us are abusing it," she said.

Mathebe indicated that some residents in the communities, who have the financial means, still do not pay for services. "Another thing that worries us is that several business establishments, including some government departments, do not pay for water services. Ironically, they all expect us to give them

Tafelkop community outrage following hit and run incident

The angry community of Tafelkop Village demands that government erects a speed hump on the village's main road. This is after more than ten pedestrians lost their lives on the R579 Road that links Tafelkop and Groblersdal Town. The latest incident occurred on the evening of Sundst incident occured ay 24 April wherein, a middle aged man was hit by a speeding Toyota Quantum tn the evening n, a middle aged man was hit by a toyota hat failed to stop after the incident. Apparently, the victim was also ran over by a speeding Toyota Avanza and died on the scene. Eyewitnesses allege that the Avanza driver had also driven off after running over the victim who succumbed to his serious injuries. On Monday morning angry residents of Mgababa Section, mobilized and attempted to erect their own speed hump on the deadly road. The crowd also threatened to disrupt the traffic until their concerns reach relevant people in government. Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr David Tladi, rushed to the scene to address the angry mob. According to residents, Tladi committed to urgently inform relevant authorities to erect speed humps at the spot where a number of fatalities have taken place. After Tladi's engagement, the community dispersed without causing any disturbance. A community member, who did not want to be named, said they are worried that the road has already claimed lives of more than ten villagers, with the government doing nothing about the situation. Another community member, Mokgadi Marule, said she was happy about the mayor's speedy response and hopes that the matter will be addressed after relevant authorities are informed. At the time of going to print, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, Brigadier Motlafela Mojapelo, did not respond to the police report requests sent to him by the paper.

uninterrupted provision of water supply and other services," she said.

According to Mathebe, the biggest contributors in the debt are the households who owe the municipality R280 Million, followed by businesses that owe R37.5 Million and government departments owing R9.3 Million. "Others such as Non-government Organizations (NGOs) and churches owe us R1.1 Million. However, Mathebe said the municipality will continue with its strategy to strengthen measures to generate revenue and improve on debt collection, as per the commitment of the governing party's election manifesto during the recent local government elections.

"We will undertake effective campaigns to deal with the culture of non-payment for services. Every person and organization that can afford it must pay for the services. Failure to do so hampers our plans to expand water services to areas where they do not exist," she said.

Mathebe stated that for some time, the municipality has been sending letters to owing clients reminding them about their debts. "We will soon pay a visit to those who continue to ignore us to demonstrate our seriousness in this regard, we have already begun to implement this internally. All our staff members were recently informed that, in line with applicable legislation, the district municipality may deduct from their salaries outstanding water and sewage payments that are in arrears for more than three months," warned Mathebe.

She said similar legislation will also apply on councillors in the district municipality and in all local municipalities of Sekhukhune. "There is no reason why a similar fate should not fall on us as councillors in all the municipalities. As councillors and municipal staff members, we must lead by example. To optimize billing and collection of rates, we must keep up with the Fourth Industrial Revolution," she said. Mathebe said the district municipality is now in the process of exploring the feasibility of installing smart meters to improve revenue collection.

Plea to find a brutal murderer

The police in Limpopo are making a plea to community members to assist in the hunt of a suspect who brutally murdered a woman and injured her 4-year-old son in Driekop outside Jane Furse last month. Brigadier Motlafela Mojapelo, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said since the incident happened on Saturday 26 March, the police launched a manhunt for the suspect without any success. The deceased's body was found in the bushes next to Mamphahlane village on Saturday 26 March 2022. "On that day, the police received a complaint from a member of the community about a child who was seen roaming the street, bleeding with open wounds on the face. The police reacted swiftly and rushed to the scene and upon arrival, the child informed them that his mother was injured at the nearby bushes. A search for the woman ensued until she was found lying on the ground in the bushes next to Mamphahlane Village, with multiple stab wounds all over her body," said Mojapelo. He said members of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) were immediately summoned and the woman was certified dead on the scene. The child was admitted at a local hospital for medical treatment. "The deceased has still not been identified. She is a young woman who might be in her thirties and was wearing a blue Jean skirt and a white t-shirt with black tiger print. The child is still being treated in hospital and is unable to shed any light in this matter," explained Mojapelo. He said the motive behind the incident is currently unknown at this stage, however, domestic or gender based violence cannot be ruled out. "Cases of murder and attempted murder have been opened and anyone with information that can help with investigations and in locating the family of the murdered woman, may urgently contact the Driekop Station Commander, Captain Samuel Segabutla on 071 602 0460, crime stop number 08600 10111, the nearest police station or make use of My SAPSApp. Police investigations are continuing," Mojapelo said. The Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Limpopo Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe condemned the incident and pleaded with anyone who might have information to come forward. "The brutal nature of this incident requires that the suspect be brought to book as speedily as possible. I therefore, call upon members of the community to assist the police in the investigations," she said.



Public asked to protect municipality infrastructure

Sekhukhune District Municipality has once again, complained about the growing scourge of vandalism of the district municipality's infrastructure, with the latest incident taken place at Mabintwane Village in Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality on Saturday 16 April. Moloko Moloto, Sekhukhune District Municipality Spokesperson, said the vandalism incident at Mabintwane was reported to the district municipality, after water supply to Phokwane was interrupted due to a cable theft at a pump station.

According to Moloto, the vandalism activities take place across the district and have resulted in the institution losing millions of Rands to repair the vandalized infrastructure. "Theft and vandalism of public infrastructure not only costs money unnecessarily, but also disrupts the provision of services," he said. Moloto said the matter is being attended to and water will be restored at the affected area as soon as their maintenance team is done with repairs. This is not the first time the district municipality complains about vandalism, mainly occurring at its water infrastructure.

In another recent incident, taken place at Ngwaritsi Village outside Monsterlus, an electricity transformer was deliberately set alight by unknown people at a water pump station. Moloto said the evidence points out that the vandals are mainly disgruntled community members who are complaining about services. "What happens is, people who vandalize the infrastructure are mostly disgruntling communities residing in newly established villages who demand municipal services immediately, which is not possible because we first have to allocate a budget before we can take services to them," he said.

Moloto added that other vandalism happens when people engage in service delivery protests, ending up damaging the same municipality infrastructure that provides services. "This is challenging because we have to resort replacing the vandalized infrastructure with the small budget we have instead of using the money to take services to the people. People should understand that this is the reason we experience a backlog in services because we have to channel the money elsewhere," he said. Moloto said curbing the problem in vast areas such as in the villages proved fruitless as fellow community members fail to report perpetrators who tamper with the municipality property. "For example, in Ngwaritsi, we have evidence that the transformer was tempered with previously and no one came forward to report the


perpetrators until recently when it was burned down, ending up hindering the municipality's concerted efforts to supply water to the villages served by the pump station," he said.

Furthermore, Moloto indicated that illegal connection of water and electricity has continued unabated across the district municipality leaving thousands of residents without water. "Such acts had dire consequences as they interrupt water supply to certain areas. People should know that each water infrastructure carries a capacity to supply a specific population or number of households at a time," Moloto detailed.

Moloto urged residents to refrain from the acts as vandalism of water infrastructure is among the worst offences perpetrated by those who have criminal intent. "People should be more vigilant, protect and safeguard the municipality infrastructure and report those who vandalize the system, everyone should take charge. I can assure that we have already opened cases against the perpetrators," he said.
