





Dennilton footballer leads Banyana Banyana to continental victory

Hilda Tholakele Magaia, from Vezinyao in Dennilton, Moutse, scored the two crucial goals to propel the South African Womens Football team to the continental glory. South Africa defeated the host, Morocco, 2-1 in the Womens Africa Cup of Nations (Wafcon) tournament final held at the Prince Moulay Stadium in Rabat, on Saturday 23 July to be crowned the champions of the African continent. The 27-year-old Magaia earned the South African Women Football team a

continental title for the first time in history. Her first goal came in the second half with a counter-attack by Jermaine Seoposenwe, who found Magaia with a short square pass in the box before she send the goalie to the wrong way to put Banyana to a 1-0 lead. Banyana's second goal came as a cross from Karabo Dhlamini, finding the on-form Magaia who was well-positioned in the box to hit the target. Morocco scored their only goal in the 80th minute through Rosella Ayane after a blunder

by the South African defense. Morocco fought back towards the final whistle but failed to equalize, despite an extra nine minutes added by the match's fourth official. South Africa was crowned 2022 Wafcon Champions with a 100% record after winning all their matches... Continues on page 4.



Suspect arrested in possession of precious metals

The Limpopo Highway Patrol (LHP) in Sekhukhune apprehended a 29-year-old suspect in possession of precious metals with an estimated street value of R100-000-00.

The suspect was arrested in Machakaneng Village outside Jane Furse along the R37, after the patrolling police spotted a horse and trailor truck surrounded by a group of people. "The patrol proceeded to the truck to investigate and upon arrival, everyone started to run away in different directions. The driver of the truck was stopped and he told the police that it was loaded with precious metals. He failed to produce the legal documentation of transporting the metal and was immediately arrested on the spot," said Lieutenant colonel Mamphaswa Seabi, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson.

Community protest disrupt water supply at St Ritas Hospital

The Limpopo Department of Health has condemned with the strongest possible terms, the blocking of the water bulk line supplying St Rita's Hospital in Glen Cowie. "It is alleged that a concerned group from Riverside settlement, have seized the distribution valves of the pipeline and have permanently closed the supply to the hospital for two weeks now. This is done in protest against lack of water in their settlement," said Health Department Spokesperson, Neil Shikwambana. He said the hospital has been relying on water tanker trucks from the municipality since the start of the problem. "The department is currently running its flagship program of Rural Health Matters in the district in order to reduce surgical backlogs in the Sekhukhune District. As one of the hospitals hosting the program, the specialists at St Rita's have been experiencing disruptions to their work due to water supply disruptions," he said. Shikwambana indicated that without trivialising the concerns of the community of Riverside, the department wishes to call on the concerned group to find other means of venting their frustrations without disrupting the functioning of the hospital that is there to serve them.

Magaia started her football career with Brazilian Ladies from Monsterlus and later joined Tshwane University of Technology (TUT), Tuks Ladies Team, before signing with Swedish club, Möron BK. She said she was inspired by then Banyana star, Portia Modise and always dreaming to play the way she plays and score goals for Banyana. Magaia made her Banyana debut in 2018 and score her first goal during that match when South Africa playing with Lesotho. She led Banyana to qualify for the Womens African Women Cup of Nations after they drew 1-1 with Algeria in Algiers, however, South Africa won 3-1 on aggregate. Magaia was also named the 2019-2020 SAFA National Womens League (SNWL) Player of the Season during her time at the TUT. She captained the side to glory in 2019 as they lifted the Women's Football Varsity Cup trophy for the sixth consecutive time. She also got her advanced diploma in business administration, which she completed in 2021. Magaia added $the\,2020\,Cosafa\,Women's\,Championship\,crown$ to her list of honours and capped her performance in that competition with the Player of the Tournament award. The footballer said her dream is to play for Chelsea Ladies team in England. The Mayor of Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality, Cllr David Tladi, expressed his joy and congratulated Magaia for her sterling performance with Banyana. "We wish to take this opportunity to congratulate her and wish her well in her football career, as a mirror to young females with intentions of becoming what she is today," he said. MEC for Sports, Arts and Culture in Limpopo, Thandi Moraka, has sent a special congratulatory message to players hailing from the province for their achievement with the national team. Police arrest 24 illegal miners

Police Joint Operation led to the arrest of 24 illegal miners at Apel outside Jane Furse on Wednesday 20 July. According to the police report, the suspects were arrested during the concerted efforts by the police aiming to clamp down on illegal mining in identified areas. "The operation was a joint effort between the police, the Departments of Home Affairs and Mineral Resources, Immigration Officials, EMS and Phoenix mine security. The various police units involved included Tactical Response Team (TRT) the Hawks, Public Order Police (POPS), LCRS, Detectives and Explosives Unit," said Lieutenant Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson. Ledwaba said twenty two of the arrested suspects were found to be in the country illegally and will face additional charges of contravening the Immigration Act. "Police confiscated 13 jackhammers, 7 buckets, one generator, 11 shovels, three electrical cords, chrome and a cash amount of R16450-00," he said. Ledwaba said the suspects, aged between 19 and 54, appeared before the Sekhukhune Magistrate's Court on 21 July 2022, facing charges of illegal mining, possession of suspected illegal mining equipment as well as chrome and contravention of the Immigration Act. "They were remanded in custody and will appear again on 3 August 2022, pending police investigation," he said. The Provincial Commissioner of Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, has welcomed the success of the of the community to report these illegal activities immediately to the police", said Hadebe.

Scholars embark on a drive to feed the homeless

A group of young people, from the Thandolenkosi Foundation, have taken an initiative to feed the hungry and displaced people in Groblersdal Town to help alleviate their plight. The scholars from Groblersdal Academy Elementary School in Groblersdal, Kabelo Mamahlodi, Michael Tau, Sphiwe Moloko, Matshepo Maserumle and Koketso Naape, started raising funds last year to feed the less fortunate in town. On Monday 18 July, during Mandela Day celebrations, the foundation took upon themselves to provide food to over 120 people in Groblersdal. The people who benefited comprises of the homeless, needy residents and unemployed people from the nearby villages and townships. "The programme started last year when we helped vulnerable displaced people by providing them with breakfast and lunch," said Thandolenkosi Foundation Chairperson Michael Tau. Tau said they started the feeding scheme drive after noticing a number of homeless people wondering the streets of Groblersdal and searching for food from the rubbish bins. "It broke our hearts every morning when we enter the school premises to see homeless people waking up in the streets not knowing what or when their next meal will be. We then started the initiative to raise funds and help them with food," he said. Tau said last year, they had to halt the initiative for a few months after going through difficult times when it comes to finances and donations. "However, we started the feeding scheme again this year after we were advised to officially register our foundation as a Non-Profit Organization (NPO) with the Department of Social Development. We then started asking for donations from people around the communities and received a lot of help. They helped a lot during Mandela Day to make our programme a huge success," he said. He said their ultimate goal is to help out as many people as possible and they are planning to extend their helping hand to assist disadvantaged learners at neighbouring places with necessities such as schools uniform and sanitary towels. "The objective of our foundation is to help our communities with everything possible that could make their life easier.

CoGHSTA MEC wraps up initiation season in Tafelkop

The MEC for Co-operative Governance, Human Settlements and Traditional Affairs (CoGHSTA), Basikopo Makamu, said the initiation school season for both male and female, went as planned in Limpopo. Makamu was speaking during the 2022 provincial initiation season closing ceremony held at the Bakgaga Ba Kopa Tribal Authority in Tafelkop on Saturday 23 July. Part of the event was a graduation ceremony of over 1600 initiates, including boys and girls, from nine initiation schools in Tafelkop and surrounding villages. "As the provincial government, together with traditional leadership and parents, we worked together to make sure that there is zero tolerance and all the initiation schools comply. We should promote our cultural practice and at the same time consider safety of our children," said Makamu. However, Makamu said the department is saddened by the death of some initiates during the period. "One death is too many, it won't be accepted. It is sad that parents take children to initiation school and end up having a situation where a boy does not come back home," he said. Makamu said the province experienced a high number of young boys and girls attending initiation school this season, as a result of the outbreak of the Covid-19 virus. "Let me indicate that the demand was so high in some areas in our province where you find that hardly five days after the initiation season started, you will have more than two thousand initiates in one school. The problem is that the overcrowding is only accepted because there is avoidance of opening of illegal initiation schools," he said. Makamu warned those who operate bogus initiation schools and parents who allow their children to attend such schools that they will be held liable of violating government's initiation schools' legislations. "I must say that in our province, we had about 29 illegal initiation schools, which we tried to close. Our challenge was that parents want their children to participate in those illegal schools and defend them. We can't allow illegal schools because we can't regulate them. There are prescribed

forms that needs to be completed and we have to invite the Department of Health to come and oversee. Such things cannot happen in the illegal initiation schools," he said. Makamu said he will be taking the illegal initiation schools issue to the senior traditional leaders so that all schools are properly regulated in the province. Kgoshi Boleu Rammupudu II, of the Bakgaga Ba Kopa Traditional Authority, took the opportunity to thank everyone who was hands on during the initiation season. "I want to thank the men who were taking care of the children in the mountains, parents, medical doctors and members of the community who supported this year's initiation season," he said.

Babina Noko gunning for 2022/2023 PSL season

Sekhukhune United FC has announced the latest additions of three players to the team, ahead of the commencement of the 2022/23 Premier Soccer League (PSL) season. The team has acquired signatures of Victor Letsoalo, Tashreeq Morris and Siphosakhe Ntiya-Ntiya. Twenty-nine-year old Victor Letsoalo was born on 1 April 1993 at Ga-Molepo Village outside Polokwane. The striker joins Babina Noko from Royal AM FC. Letsoalo started his career with Baroka FC in 2017 before joining Bloemfontein Celtic. He had a stellar 2021/22 season with "Thwihli Thwahla", as he scored 16 goals, a tally only bettered by Mamelodi Sundowns Peter Shalulile. He made his debut for South Africa national soccer team on 13 July 2021 in a 2021 COSAFA Cup game against Lesotho and scored a hat-trick in a 4-0 victory, becoming the first Bafana Bafana player to score three times on his national team debut. Letsoalo said although it is going to be a challenge to move to a new club in the new environment, he will do his best to play well and work together with his teammates to win the matches. Tashreeq Morris (28), is a forward player who was born on 13 May 1994 in Cape Town. He started his football career with Ajax Cape Town Youth Academy in Ikamva from amateur club Juventus FC. Morris represented the "Urban Warriors" in a number of youth tournaments and was part of the winning squad during the Metropolitan Under-19 Premier Cup and the Copa Amsterdam held in 2013. Morris was promoted to the first-team of Ajax Cape Town (currently known as Cape Town Spurs) during the preparation for the 2013/14 PSL season. He made his league debut as a substitute against







Kaizer Chiefs on 5 November 2013 and scored The left-back, Ntiya-Ntiya (25) was born on a winning goal in 1-0 victory. Morris Joined Cape Town City FC in 2019 and made 20 league appearances in the 2021/22 PSL campaign. He was also part of the South Africa National Olympic team that has participated in 2016 Olympics games held in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil.

6 October 1996 in Bizana, Eastern Cape. He joins Babina Noko from Kaizer Chiefs. Ntiya-Ntiya started his football career in mid 2000s with Durban based team, Barsenal. He joined Kaizer Chiefs development team in 2016 and made his debut for the club in January 2018.
