Over 900 people nabbed during police operations

The well coordinated SAPS Tactical Intelligence driven joint operations, conducted across the Limpopo Province in April 2021, yield positive results as 944 people were arrested on various crimes. The operations consisted of members derived from various police units in partnership with various stakeholders. Colonel Moatshe Ngoepe, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said the arrested suspects, aged between 21 and 58, have started appearing before different magistrate courts across the province, for offences ranging from illegal firearms and possession of suspected stolen property that was found in their possession. "In one of the operations, conducted at Ga-Masemola policing precinct outside Jane Furse in the Sekhukhune District, a 21-year-old suspect was arrested after he was positively linked to business robbery and carjacking that occurred earlier this month at Apel Cross. The operation comprised of the Masemola Detectives, Crime Intelligence Unit and the K9 Unit," he said. Ngoepe added that the suspect is one of three wanted criminals who allegedly hijacked a VW Polo, forced the driver into the car boot and drove to a nearby tavern where they robbed the owner of a cash amount of money on gunpoint. "The victim alerted members of the community and the suspects fled the scene on foot, abandoning the vehicle. The hijacked victim was then rescued and police were notified. The suspect was arrested at his house in Mapoteng section and a 9mm firearm and one magazine were recovered. A police manhunt for the remaining suspects is still underway," explained Ngoepe. He said 192 suspects were also arrested for the Contravention of the Disaster Management Act. "The other suspects are facing charges such as stock theft, possession of unlicensed firearms and ammunition, possession of suspected stolen properties, perjury, murder, attempted murder, dealing in illicit cigarettes and drugs, burglaries, robberies, illegal mining, sexual offences, assault and contravention of the illegal Immigration Act and Road Traffic Act," he said. Ngoepe said in another incident, that occurred in the Driekop policing area of the Sekhukhune District, a 31-year-old man was arrested by members of the LHP, after the truck he was travelling in was pulled off along the R71 road. "The trailer was found loaded with unprocessed chrome valued at over R100 000. The suspect was also charged with contravention of the illegal Immigration Act," he said. Ngoepe said during the operations, as part of enforcing compliance with the Liquor Act, 94 fines were issued for liquor related offences and 26 shebeens were also closed."The conducted operations also led to the confiscation of 5 stolen/robbed motor vehicles, 13 knives, 26 dangerous weapons,


797 942ml liquor, 9773 sticks of illicit cigarettes, 241grams of nyaope drugs, 3372 grams of dagga, 05 dagga plants, 934 fines relating to the Road Traffic Act, were issued," he said. The Provincial Commissioner of the police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Nneke Ledwaba, has welcomed the arrests and urged the police to keep fighting criminality in the province by working closely with communities including private sectors to create a safer environment.

Sekhukhune District Municipality (SDM) has condemned acts of violence implicating one of their senior officials, following altercation and assault acts committed by one of their senior officials against a female victim in Groblersdal. The assault was captured in a video that has since gone viral on social media. The official was identified asMpho Maepa. "The Sekhukhune District Municipality has learned with disgust about a video on social media, in which a female is being harassed, insulted and seemingly assaulted, by a male employee of the municipality," said SDM Spokesperson, Moloko Moloto. Moloto indicated that, even though, the incident happened outside the workplace, and that the victim is not a municipal employee, the district municipality still, does not take kindly to it."First, we confirm that the male who is captured in the video is indeed a senior official who recently acted as chief financial officer of the district municipality. Secondly, the district municipality is disgusted and disappointed that one of its officials perpetuates gender based violence, a social ill that has become an intolerably painful affliction in our country. Moloto informed that the district municipality has held campaigns against gender based violence, and the Executive Mayor Cllr Keamotseng Stanley Ramaila has repeatedly encouraged victims of GBV to speak out." Therefore, the municipality applauds the victim for speaking out. While the victim indicates on social media that she has lodged a formal complaint with the South African Police Services, a decision the municipality applauds, the municipality will, as the employer, get to the bottom of this matter, with a view of taking appropriate action," explained Moloto. He pleaded that the complainant is urged to get in touch with the municipality to assist with the internal investigation." Last year, President Cyril Ramaphosa declared the scourge of gender based violence a second pandemic which all South Africans must fight against," he said. Moloto stressed that SDM will not tolerate any conduct that seeks to undermine efforts to rid our society of gender based violence. Economic Freedom fighters (EFF) Councillor in SDM, said the opposition condemn the official's GBV acts with strongest possible terms. "The official should be suspended immediately. We can't stand for immoral acts against women perpetuated by a public figure," he said. Maloba said the party will support the victim and make sure that the implicated official is held accountable and face the full might of the law.

She indicated that despite the pressing challenges, which includes the novel coronavirus pandemic that engulf the country and subsequent lockdown announced by President Cyril Ramaphosa earlier last year, the municipality was able to defeat all odds and ensured that its finances are fairly and appropriately presented to the auditor general. "The municipality is also delighted that this was an improved audit outcome compared to the previous ones," she said. Bahula thanked the municipality team for their commitment towards a clean governance in the municipality.



Relocation of Sekhukhune District offices well

underway

The Limpopo MEC for Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure, Namane Dickson Masemola, continues engagements with the Mamone traditional leaders in earnest to see the long awaited relocation of Sekhukhune District to become a reality. The district offices, including that of health and transport, are still located at Lebowakgomo in the Capricorn Municipality, about 50km away from Sekhukhune. The Acting Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District, Cllr Ali Matlala and the Mayor of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality Cllr MinahBahula were part of the engagements. "The MEC is pulling together all key stakeholders to ensure that this project becomes a success, and the value and socio-economic growth it will bring to the entire District sees the light of day," said Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure Spokesperson Joel Seabi. Seabi said the department is waiting for KgoshiMalekutuMampuru IV to release the land for the offices, which is a project that will be implemented soon around Jane Furse area. The Acting Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District, Cllr Ali Matlala and the Mayor of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality Cllr MinahBahula were part of the engagements." KgošiMalekutuMampu ru IV accepted the proposal by the department to release earmarked land of about 50 hectares that would enable about 10 district departments, and other key national departments including Sekhukhune District Municipality offices, to be housed into a government office complex at Jane Furse under Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality," he said. Seabi said MEC Masemola agreed with the traditional authority that more land will be requested in the near future to work on a complete Jane Furse Township development project. During the engagements, Masemola said the relocation project will create about 3000 jobs to locals.

Moutse residents march for better services

On Thursday 22 April, dozens of residents from various villages of Moutse, marched to Philadelphia Hospital in Dennilton to hand-over their memorandum of demands for better services. The group of disillusioned residents, handedover the memorandum to representatives from office of the Presidency earlier that day. Among their concerns, the community complain about poor services in the hospital, the incorporation of Moutse back to Mpumalanga Province and other poor service concerns, lack of water in main. Community leader, FanaMasinga, informed the Dispatch that poor service delivery in Moutsedates back to 2006 after the area was incorporated from Mpumalanga to Limpopo. "We march to demand better services in the hospital and other basic services in our communities. We want new management for the hospital," he said. Masinga added that they are worried about the deteriorating operations at Philadelphia Hospital, ranging from shortage of medication, shortage of staff members, unhygienic conditions, shortage of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and shortage of ambulances. "We demand Health Department MEC Dr PhophiRamathuba to recall the hospital CEO, risk manager and clinical manager with immediate effect," he said. Masinga said residents are also frustrated by shortage of recreationalcentres, which could have played a part in taking young people from the streets. "We demand the renovation of OR Tambo stadium, a information centre, a public library and a community hall that will help shape the future of our younger generation," he said. Masinga indicated that among their grievances, is their long overdue plea to be returned to Mpumalanga Province. "No proper consultations were done when the move was materialized. We are concerned because of poor services in the Limpopo administration. We are tired and need immediate actions from the authorities," he said. The office of the president was given fourteen working days to respond to the challenges raised by residents. "Failure to do so, we will be forced to go to the streets," said Masinga.

House breakings on the rise in Elandsdoorn

The community of Elandsdoorn in Moutse is concerned about the spike of house breaking incidents that seems to be on the rise in the area. According to residents, a number of houses have been broken into recently where the criminals stole electrical appliances. Community leader, Ali Maloba, said they are worried about safety of residents as the criminals who commit these crimes are still on the loose. "The crimes are taking place in Elandsdoorn and surrounding villages. We plead with residents in the area to be on high alert of these criminals. The number of these incidents is alarming and increasing," he said. Maloba said some of these incidents take place during broad daylight, between 8am and 10am and also in the afternoons between 1pm and 3pm. "The targeted Victims are the elderly residents, specifically pensioners and vulnerable young adults," he said. Maloba said plans to establish street committees that will help to get rid of the crimes are in the pipeline. "We will also involve the police community services. We want every relevant stakeholder to be a part of these committees," he said. Maloba said community engagements will also be held to make people alert of the crimes and involve them in the formation of street committees.

Notorious criminals arrested

The police in Jane Furse made a major breakthrough, arresting two members of a gang of most wanted suspects who committed various crimes around Sekhukhune. According to the police, the arrested suspects, Service Mashilo (34) and Ben Thobejane (41), were linked with ten serious and violent cases ranging from murder, ATM bombings, safe blasting and business robberies. "These suspects, who are believed to be part of a gang of criminals that has been terrorising members of the community, especially the business sector in and around the Sekhukhune District, were apprehended at their homes during the Tactical Intelligence driven joint operation conducted by the Saps Limpopo Provincial Tracking Team, Provincial Investigations Unit, the Saps Limpopo Highway Patrol Team and members of the Jane Furse Police Station," said Colonel MoatsheNgoepe, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson. Ngoepe said the other three suspects, who were earlier arrested along with the duo, were released as they could not be linked to the cases. "Several items such as Plasma TVs, clothing, cellphones and fridges that were reportedly stolen from various retail stores and residences were recovered during the arrest," Ngoepe said. He indicated that preliminary police investigations further indicated that one of the suspects, Mashilo, was out on bail for an ATM bombing case which took place at Mahlakung plaza in the Sekororo area under Maake Policing precinct outside Tzaneen in the Mopani District, during October 2020. Ngoepe said Mashilo appeared before the Sekhukhune Magistrate's Court on Friday 23 April and will appear again soon together with Thobejane for formal bail application. "Manhunt for the remaining suspects is still underway. Anyone with information that can lead to their arrest, may
