





# Anarchy as Philadelphia Hospital back-up power fails

For the past two months, lack of back-up power supply has caused a serious disruption of services in Philadelphia Hospital during load shedding periods.

This is as a result of generator failure since June 2022. Staff members in the institution are urged to use candles and power saver lights during load shedding. According to a staff nurse who did not want to be named, the situation hits hard on critical wards including the ICU, labour, operating theatre, casualty and neo natal wards. "We cannot perform our duties when the power is out. The generator is 30 years old and has a serious mechanical problem," she said. She said despite numerous concerns raised by staff members to the hospital CEO, Dr Matome Lebea; they were told power crisis will be addressed soon, however, the problem is still persisting. "The hospital morgue is in shambles, families are instructed to take bodies of their deceased members to private mortuaries. The situation is affecting the morale of staff members," she said. The Democratic Alliance (DA) in Limpopo, says it has written a letter to Health MEC Dr Phophi Ramathuba, to urgently address the problem.

Risham Maharaj MPL, DA Limpopo Spokesperson for Health, said during the party's oversight inspection, it was revealed that the hospital has not had a functioning generator. "There have been numerous complaints from hospital staff that it is completely dark in the hospital during load shedding and it badly affects the operating theatre, ICU, casualty and neonatal unit. Staff indicated that they end up using their own lights," he said. Maharaj indicated that the staff also claims that some of the mortuary fridges have been damaged by load shedding and it has also affected the storage of certain medicines in the pharmacy. "Complaints from community members also seemingly indicate that there is lower capacity to treat patients during load shedding with no generator," he said. ......story continues on page 2.

According to Maharaj, the hospital management indicated that the generator had a mechanical breakdown due to the increased load shedding and they were in the process of assessing whether to repair or to purchase a new generator.

"They also indicated that ICU cases were being diverted to other hospitals like Mankweng, Matlala and Groblersdal in the interim as a contingency. It is clear that the increased pressure on the energy grid and the rolling blackouts risks the health of citizens that depend on Limpopo's public healthcare facilities. It is unacceptable for a hospital to go 6 days without a generator for back-up power and even with contingencies in place there is a risk of losing lives while transporting these critically ill patients to other hospitals," he said. Maharaj emphasized that Philadelphia Hospital is already currently facing 82 cases of medico legal claims in excess of R650 million, which is the highest in the Sekhukhune District. "Ramathuba must urgently assist the hospital management in addressing the generator issue as well as staff and community concerns. The DA is committed to ensuring that residents of Limpopo continue to receive

healthcare services, even during rolling blackouts brought on by an uncaring ANC government," he said. Health Department Spokesperson, Neil Shikwambana, did not respond to messages sent by the Dispatch for a comment and Shikwambana did not answer phone calls when the paper attempted to get a comment.

# Mayor pledges support to families of fatal accident victims

The Mayor of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality Cllr Minah Bahula, has on Monday 26 September, paid homage to convey condolences to the Debeila and Mokalapa families at Tswaing, Ga-Masemola Village, following a horrific car accident that claimed lives of two young people. Five people were involved in an accident that happened on Saturday 24 September, at night.

Two people died and two others suffered serious injuries, whilst one survived with minor injuries. It is alleged that when the accident happened, five people were driving from a nearby petrol station when they drove into another vehicle whilst trying to avoid a head on collision with the incoming heavy truck. The deceased where both pursuing their studies at different tertiary institutions. During the visit, the mayor conveyed condolences and subsequently, pledged that the municipality will support to the bereaved families and committed to assist with funeral logistics.

The two families are planning to organize a joint funeral at a central venue in the village with the help from the municipality.

#### Seventeen-year-old rapist released on free bail

The police in Vaalbank outside Siyabuswa have arrested a 17-year-old male in connection with rape of his 54-year-old aunt.

The police said the incident occurred on Thursday 22 September at Molapologe Village. Colonel Donald Mdhluli, Mpumalanga Provincial Police Spokesperson, who described the incident as a loss of morale and a cause of concern to the society, said the scholar had repedeadly raped his aunt in countless occasions before the incident was reported to the police. "The incident was reported to the police by the aunt who lost her patience, as she could no longer handle the abuse anymore," he said. According to Mdhluli, the aunt alleges that the suspect started his evil deeds between April 2022 and early September 2022. "It is further

alleged that the victim warned him multiple times to stop his abuse, but the plea reportedly fell into deaf ears. She therefore reported the matter to the authorities and the case was assigned to the Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offences Unit (FCS)," explained Mdhluli. He said the case was immediately investigated and thereafter, the suspect who will not be named because he is still a minor, was arrested. "He appeared in the Mbibana Magistrate's Court on Friday, 23 September 2022. The case was postponed to Monday, 26 September 2022 and he was released on free bail," he said.

Mdhluli said the case was postponed until Tuesday 4 October 2022, pending further police investigation. The Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Mpumalanga, Lieutenant General Semakaleng Daphney Manamela, has raised a concern regarding cases, which happen behind closed doors and mostly go unreported. "Women should break the silence on Gender Based Violence (GBV) issues that have been engulfed our communities. This calls for all of us to commit ourselves in fighting this pandemic," she said.






#### **EMLM conducts Mayoral Imbizo**

The Mayor of Elias Motsaoledi Local Municipality, Cllr David Tladi, said the first pillar of service delivery in the municipality is infrastructure development. Tladi was speaking during the Mayoral Outreach Imbizo, held at Real Stars Sports Grounds in Thabakhubedu Village in Dennilton, on Thursday 15 September. He said the municipality is committed to electrify Masakaneng Settlement, Makaepea Village, Nyakelang in Tafelkop, Phomola, Phooko, Belfasts, Maphepha and Mmotewaneng. In conclusion, Tladi said the municipality took in account issues and concerns raised by communities, including escalation of crime within the area, the provision of houses, water supply challenge, facilities for social services and poor road maintenance.

## Court dismisses senior traffic official sentence appeal



A senior traffic official in Limpopo, Portia Ramphelo, lost her two year sentence appeal after convicted and found guilty for corruption.

The Democratic Alliance (DA) in Limpopo said it has welcomed the two year prison sentence handed down against provincial traffic official Portia Ramphelo, who was found guilty of soliciting bribes of up to R2000 from motorists during 2017. The 37-year-old accused was convicted of corruption and found guilty in 2019, however, she appealed her sentence earlier this month and lost in court. Ramphelo was arrested together with 12 other traffic police officials by the Hawks during December 2017. Hawks Spokesperson in Limpopo, Matimba Maluleke, said the court dismissed the accused's appeal and ordered her to start serving her two year jail sentence. DA Provincial Spokesperson for Department of Transport and Community Safety, Katlgo Suzan Phala, said the party is pleased that Ramphelo's appeal was dismissed by the court and this will serve as example to other traffic officials who have intentions of taking bribes. "Over the past number of years, Limpopo has been plagued by allegations of corrupt Transport Department officials, testing station officials and traffic officers," she said. In 2019, a Special Investigating Unit (SIU) report identified 43 Limpopo traffic officials involved in serious crimes that include among others fraud and corruption. Phala said the DA believes that traffic officials who solicit bribes from motorists enable reckless behaviour on our roads which leads to fatal accidents. "We reiterate our call for a register which will assist the department to keep record of all officers found guilty of serious transgressions, which will also assist in monitoring whether officials who are found guilty have been subjected to consequence management or proper disciplinary action," Phala said. Phala insisted that the DA believes that getting rid of corrupt traffic officials will assist to keep motorists safer on our roads. "We will further be writing to the MEC for Transport & Community Safety, Polly Boshielo, to request information on all outstanding cases pending against traffic officials implicated in corruption and bribery," she said.

#### Six arrested for dealing with counterfeit goods

Six foreign nationals were arrested by the Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation (Hawks) after they were found dealing in counterfeit goods in their shops. The suspects were arrested during a raid conducted in Dennilton, Marble Hall, Nebo and Jane Furse respectively. According to Limpopo Hawks Spokesperson, the Hawks received intelligence about shops that were selling counterfeit goods in Sekhukhune area and operationalized it. "During the operation, boxes containing counterfeit Anchor yeast and Gold Star yeast, with the estimated value of over R20 000-00 were seized," he said. Maluleke said the first three accused, Fekele Oold Anulo (21), Ayolo Waje (31) and Muhammad Ali (29) arrested in Dennilton and Marble-Hall already appeared in Moutse and Groblersdal Magistrates' Court on Thursday 23 September for dealing in counterfeit goods and contravening the Immigration Act and they were remanded in custody. Maluleke said the other three suspects arrested in Nebo and Jane Furse, Heeray Khan (33), Desta Adeno Masebo (25) and Temesgen Ergecho (31), appeared before the Nebo Magistrate's Court on Friday 23 September and were released on R3000-00 bail each. "They will be appearing again on 3 October 2022 following further investigations," he said.



## **Executive Mayor meets new Traditional Leadership**

The Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality Cllr Julia Lata Mathebe, said the district municipality will intensify relations with the local traditional leadership.

Mathebe said during her meeting with the newly elected Sekhukhune House of Traditional Leaders led by its Chairperson Kgoshi Maila. The meeting was organized in Groblersdal on Wednesday 14 September by Mathebe together with her MMCs, Bella Kupa, Mariam Malatji, and Kukie Sefala. According to the district municipality, the purpose of the meeting was to affirm the continuous relationship between government and traditional authorities to accelerate service delivery. During the engagement, Kgoshi Maila requested the executive mayor to focus more on improving the provision of access roads, clean drinkable water and employment opportunities, particularly for the youth, women and people with disabilities. The executive mayor assured Kgoshi Maila and the entire traditional leaders that the 5th term administration's priority, through the "Tlema Tekkie, Re Nwe Meetsi" campaign, is to fast track all water projects in the district municipality in order to sustainably provide clean drinkable water to communities. The Operation Tlema Tekkie RE New Meetsi Campaign was launched by Mathebe during her inaugural ceremony as the new executive mayor of the district municipality. At the time, Mathebe said the campaign is a call to action to all people to participate, from the executive mayor to member of mayoral committee, ward councillors, to municipal officials at every level. # Public-Police partnership encouraged during Crime Awareness Campaign

Police members of Dennilton SAPS, led by Colonel Makaleng, have on Saturday 17 September, conducted a crime awareness campaign at Matlala Lehwelere Village outside Groblersdal. The crime prevention drive was aiming to promote a relationship, wherein, communities were advised to establish neighbourhood watch and street committees to prevent house burglaries. Sergeant Maphure Manamela, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said the police-community engagement was alerting residents, informing them to refrain from mob justice acts which are prevalent in the area recently. The Matlala area is experiencing a challenge of stock theft, in which the criminals are targeting cattle and goats belonging to locals. Some of the suspects who were caught in the act were beaten and burned alive by the angry residents in the area recently. "Livestock owners were advised to brand mark their animals and avoid hiring undocumented foreign nationals. They were also encouraged to report any criminal activities to the police and refrain from mob justice," Manamela said. In addition, Manamela said the community was advised to install security measures such as burglar windows and doors. Meanwhile the Sekhukhune SAPS Social Crime Prevention Coordinator, Sgt Lesetja Mphahlele, together with Community Policing Forum (CPF) members, conducted the Safer School Campaign at Ngwanangwato Secondary School in Ga-Rantho Village in Ngwaabe outside Jane Furse. The members paid homage to the school after the principal complaint about usage of dagga by the learners. On arrival the team addressed about 730 learners during assembly time and they were warned about issues such as dangers of drugs and alcohol abuse, Ill-discipline, engaging in sexual activities at young age, carrying or possession of dangerous weapons, bullying, peer pressure and effect of criminal record. The team proceeded to a neighboring shop and warn the owner to refrain from selling learners anything through the school fence including cigarettes. Mr Mogashoa, the school principal, appreciated the police and CPF intervention, saying it will play a role in changing the behavious of learners.

### Youth empowered in Agricultural Summit

Hundreds of aspirant and established youth were empowered during the Makhuduthamaga Youth in Agriculture Summit, held at the Kgaola Mafiri Municipal Building (Gymnasium) in Jane Furse, Dichoueng intersection on Thursday 22 September. According to the local municipality, the summit was organized in order to engage in an information sharing exercise and to provide the youth with gainful opportunities and experience in the sector. Addressing the young people, acting Mayor, Cllr Namudi Matjomane, said agriculture remains the backbone of economic growth in communities and the municipality. #### Missing woman sought by Sekhukhune Police

The Police in Sekhukhune are requesting the public to assist in locating the whereabouts of a missing, 21-year-old woman Mahlatse Thuli Phetla, from Ga-Malekana Village outside Jane Furse. According to the police report, it is alleged that the victim was last seen on Friday 2 September 2022 around 17:00, by her younger brother going to a local spaza shop and she has since disappeared. "The police, community members and K9 unit members conducted a search at the village without success.

The type of clothes she was wearing are currently unknown," said Sergeant Monatse Mamabolo, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson. Mamabolo said attempts to locate the missing woman from friends and families bore no fruits.
