# Vandalism acts worsen draught in Moutse Villages

Residents of Moutse have expressed shock over a vandalized water pump station in Waalkraal, which causes serious water shortages in the already draught stricken area. The pump station used to draw water from the dried-up Mkhombo Dam and supplies both Moutse East and West Villages. A community leader, Ali Maloba, said during their assessment on the status of water following persistent rains, they discovered that the Waalkraal pump station is in a state of despair with all important equipment missing. "The vandalism is seemingly at 80%, with water pumping machinery, including motors, all stolen," he said. Maloba said the security personnel working there indicated that in most instances, they are attacked or ambushed by not less than 30 heavily armed men, clearly indicating that the vandalism mission is well planned."The unfortunate part is that in order for Moutse East and West to have water, they all depend on this pump station," he said. According to Maloba, acts of internal planned sabotage from government could not be ruled out in these criminal acts. Maloba said they pleaded with Sekhukhune District Municipalityto consider applying and developing a new plant from Loskop daminstead of fixing the Waalkraal pump station."It must be noted that this marks the 5th year the community of Moutse East and West being without bulk supply, whereby pensioners, grant recipients andpeople living with disability continue to buy water from private companies daily. They are charged R500-00 to refilla 2400 litre tank," he said. When contacted for a comment, Sekhukhune District Municipality Spokesperson, Moloko Moloto, referred the paper to Dr JS Moroka Local Municipality. The Dr JS Moroka Local Municipality was not available for a comment at the time of going to press.

#### Tragic accident claims lives of three Highshool Ben Viljoen matriculants

Three matric learners from Highschool Ben Viljoen in Groblersdal have died in a horrific accident that happened on Friday 3 December. JG Greyling, Stiaan Grobler and Conrad Meiring perished in the tragic accident that occurred in the Western Cape. Reports indicate that four learners were in the car at the time of the accident. Adrian Myburg sustained serious injuries and the other three succumbed to their injuries. The boys were believed to have been on holidays in the Western Cape after completing their matric exams on Wednesday 1 December. According to Captain Malcolm Potjie, Western Cape Provincial Police Spokesperson, the victims were driving in a Lexus. The vehicle lost control between Glentana and George along the N2 Road. He said JG, Stiaan and Conrad were certified dead on the scene and Adrian Myburg was admitted in hospital. Highschool Ben Viljoen has on Sunday 5 December confirmed the tragic loss on their Facebook page. "A silence descended on Highschool Ben Viljoen and the community. With great sadness we learned of the passing of JG Greyling, Stiaan Grobler and Conrad Meiring in a car accident on 3 December. It's a sad day with the loss of these young men, Learners for whom adventure was part of their way of life. With a smile they tackled life, each with its own future dreams and ideals. Always well mannered and respectful, stalwarts on various terrains. Our hearts go out to their families. Words fall short but these learners will live on in all of our hearts," said the school. MEC for Education Department in Limpopo, Polly Boshielo, sent her heartfelt condolences to the families, friends and the school. "This is really sad news, that we are all still trying to come to terms with. We are truly heartbroken to have lost these young people who were preparing to conquer the world, after finishing their National Senior Certificate (NSC) Examinations. This is a loss not only to their families, but to the entire school community and us as a department," she said. Boshielo went on and said: "Our deepest condolences go out to their families, friends and the school. We pray that they be granted strength to get through this difficult time. We are also thankful for the life of the learner who survived and wish him a speedy recovery," she said. Boshielo assured that the Department of Education Office in Sekhukhune District is in touch with the school and working on arrangements for provision of Psycho-social counselling for those in need. The victims' wreath-laying ceremony was held at the school's premises on Tuesday 7 December, with teachers, learners, representatives from the Limpopo Department of Education and community members attending.



#### Head on collision claims four lives at Moteti

The wreckage of the vehicles that were burned beyond recognition in an accident that claimed lives of five people on the R573 between Moteti and Kwaggafontein.

A horrific head on collision accident between a Light Delivery Vehicle (LDV) and a VW sedan left four men dead. The accident occurred in the late hours of Monday 29 November on the notorious R573 Road between Moteti and Kwaggafontein. "The crash occurred just before 18:30 and the deceased were certified dead on the scene," said Moeti Mmusi, Spokesperson for Mpumalanga Department of Community Safety, Security and Liaison. Mmusi said during the accident, the LDV caught fire upon impact but the driver, who was the only occupant, was ejected out of the vehicle before it caught fire and unfortunately, he later succumbed to his injuries. "The four deceased includes both drivers and two passengers who were occupants in the sedan. The traffic officers were immediately deployed to the scene to redirect traffic as the road was temporary closed. Furthermore, various emergency personnel were also deployed to the scene," added Mmusi. He said the cause of the crash is still unknown but the probe has already commenced. Mpumalanga MEC for Community Safety, Security and Liaison, Vusi Shongwe, has urged motorists to be more cautious on the road especially after sunset when visibility is reduced. "Motorists are called upon to exercise due diligence and also obey the rules. They need to also adjust their driving to various prevailing conditions on the road," said Shongwe. The MEC also sent his heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families.

#### Makhuduthamaganew councillors attend induction programme

Newly elected councillors of Makhuduthamaga Local Municipality were taken through a coordinated induction programme organized by the South African Local Government Association (SALGA). The programme was organized at the municipality offices on Monday 29 November, with Deputy Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs (Cogta), Thembi Simelane-Nkadimeng attending. The programme was established by SAGA to capacitate new elected councillors with general knowledge and understanding of their leadership role and legislations that guides local government. Among other things, councillors are capacitated on the leadership role, legislations that are applicable within the space they will be operating in as well as developmental local government and service delivery. During the induction session, Deputy Minister Simelane-Nkadimeng encouraged Councillors to equip themselves with municipal processes and the overall South African local government system. "But also for our councillors should prioritize education and register with Institutions of higher learning and capacitate themselves further. The reality is education is a personal developmental choice. It is entirely up to you to embrace this opportunity and continue to equip yourselves," she said. The deputy minister also urged councillors to put aside their political differences and become public representatives that will work towards a common purpose, by formulating policies that will impact the lives of the communities for the better.

#### DA to question high unemployment rate issues in the Legislature

The Democratic Alliance (DA) in Limpopo, says it will table a motion with notice during the upcoming Legislature sitting to debate the high rate of unemployment in the province, the ineptness of the provincial government and its entities to effectively compete with the private sector and the failure of government to create a conducing environment for investment and job creation. According to Risham Maharaj, DA Spokesperson in the office of the premier, the opposition party is concerned about the rapid increase of unemployment in the province. "The third term's Quarterly Labour Force Survey (QLFS), released recently, revealed that Limpopo's expanded unemployment rate has risen to 54.5%, a year-on-year increase of 7.6 percentage points," he said. Maharaj added that Limpopo further recorded the second largest increase in the official unemployment rate in the third quarter, wherein it was an increase of up 2.1 percentage points from 30.4% to 32.5%."These statistics effectively mean that out of a workforce of 3 890 000, just over a million people are employed," informed Maharaj. He indicated that all sectors, with the exception of construction, experienced quarter-to-quarter losses in employment affecting the Agriculture industry where 20 000 jobs were lost, Mining sector with 11 000 jobs lost, Manufacturing industry where 12 000 lost their jobs, Trade industry with 31 000 loss of jobs, Community and social services where 37 000 lost their jobs and in the Private households sector where 19 000 people lost their jobs."It is extremely concerning that despite heavy job losses over the past 18 months, Premier Stanley Mathabatha has not yet changed Limpopo's trajectory," Maharaj said. Maharaj indicated that despite a dwindling tax base, a stagnant Gross Domestic Product (GDP), two dormant Special Economic Zones (SEZ), bankrupt government subsidiaries and a bloated public sector wage bill, it is still just business as usual for the premier and his executive."During the debate on the unemployment pandemic, the DA will put forward implementable plans that will get things done and effect real change to people's lives and not just a barrage of empty promises," he said.

The newly inaugurated Executive Mayor of Sekhukhune District Municipality, Cllr Keamotseng Stanley Ramaila, said the district municipality will fight decisively against corrupt councillors and officials. Ramaila was speaking during his inauguration ceremony at the Groblersdal Agricultural Hall on Thursday 2 December. "The residents of our district are tired of having their district municipality hogging media headlines for all the wrong reasons. They have had enough of this embarrassing news of millions of rand which are meant to provide them with services, disappearing," he said. In 2018, the Sekhukhune District Municipality lost the excess of R5.4 Million, which was deposited into wrong bank accounts instead of service providers' accounts. Four officials were suspended in relation to corruption charges and a case against them is still underway. However, the district municipality managed to recover 90 percent of the stolen money. A year later in 2019, R12 Million, which was meant for Compensation for Occupational

Injuries and Diseases Act, was also deposited in a fraudulent account. No one has been charged and the money was never recovered. Ramaila assured residents of Sekhukhune that corruption and maladministration will not be tolerated. "Absolutely no one, is entitled to steal from our people, irrespective of positions they hold, their social or political standing," he said.

Ramaila indicated that the district municipality will be operating in line with remarks made by President Cyril Ramaphosa in which among other things include; dealing decisively and immediately with corruption, mismanagement, waste, and under-performance, removing from office those who fail to do what they are paid to do. "This is not a threat of a purge. Many of our municipal officials are dedicated, hardworking and ethical and they have absolutely nothing to worry about. But those who have their hands in the cookie jar, must know that their days are numbered," he said.



#### Search operation for missing 19-yearold woman

The Police in Hlogotlououtside Monsterlushave launched a search operation to locate a missing 19-year-old woman named, Andiswa Zulu. According to the police, the victim, from Eenzaam-Village has gone missing in March 2021 and was never seen again. "The victim allegedly left home going to St Rita's Hospital to give birth on 3 March 2021 at around 15:30. Her mother reportedly went to the hospital later to check on her but was informed that her daughter was never admitted in that hospital," said Constable Maphure Manamela, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson. Manamela added that it was also reported that the mother spoken to the victim over the phone on 29 April 2021 and since then, her phone is going straight to voicemail and her whereabouts are unknown."She was last seen wearing long floral dress with brown jersey and pink sandals. Police conducted search operations at relatives, friends and the surrounding areas with no success," Manamela explained. She said anyone with information that can

#### Tombstone troubles cause unveiling postponements

Several families from villages surrounding Groblersdal have had to postpone their unveiling ceremonies because the company where they bought their tombstones from failed to deliver as promised.

The families claim they bought their tombstones at Valley Tombstone in Groblersdal and the company undertook to erect the stones within three months. But some families claim they have been waiting for over two years for their stones to be erected. Collin Kgrariya, from Tafelkop outside Groblersdal, claims he paid the company R8 500-00 in August 2019. "The company promised to deliver the tombstone in April 2020 and based on this assurance, we decided on the date of the unveiling ceremony, which passed without the tombstone been erected," he said.

Kgariya said he had been sent from pillar to post ever since when visiting the company to get answers about the delay. Another disgruntled customer, Emmanuel Radingwane, said he paid the company R12 000 cash and has been waiting for his tombstone since May 2021. "I was promised the tombstone will be erected within three months. They keep on postponing the delivery date everytime when I contact them," he said.

Radingwane added that he had to postpone his unveiling ceremony because the company failed to deliver the tombstone in time. "Last time I suggested if they can refund my money and they refused and promised to deliver in the next few days. They always fail to honour their promise. I'm now thinking of taking a legal route because seemingly, they will not erect the tombstone at all," he said.

Valley Tombstone was not immediately available as both their cellphones rang unanswered.






#### **TUPS** to host massive Festive tournament in Jane **Furse**




## Golf clash at the Sekhukhune Golf DevelopmentDay Tournament
