



ANC Limpopo recalls four mayors

The African National Congress (ANC) in Limpopo has announced that the party decided to remove three mayors, Maleke Mokganyetji from Sekhukhune District Municipality (SDM), Dowelani Nenguda who was them Executive Mayor of Vhembe District Municipality, Shadrack Maluleke who was Mayor of Collins Chabane Local Municipality (CCLM) and then Mayor of Makhado Local Municipality (MLM) Samuel Munyai. ANC Provincial Spokesperson in Limpopo, Jimmy Machaka, said the resolution to remove the mayors was taken during the party's Provincial Executive Committee (PEC) meeting held on Tuesday 7 November at the Peter Mokaba Stadium in Polokwane. It is alleged that the mayors were removed as a result of political factions within the organization, however, Machaka said some were removed as a result of outstanding positions since last local government election. Mokganyetji, who was hopeful to occupy the position in Sekhukhune for the entire term, replaced Julia Mathebe who resigned after being implicated in the VBS scandal last year. "Following nominations and submissions of names by the affected regional executive committees as well as interviews conducted our national office, the following are ANC candidates for the positions of mayors in the following municipalities. Minah Bahula for Sekhukhune District Municipality, Freddah Nkondo for Vhembe District Municipality, Dorcus Mboy for Makhado Local Municipality and Shadrack Maluleke for Collins Chabane Local Municipality," he said. Machaka said the PEC further noted that the deployments of new mayors will affect other positions within the political management teams of some municipalities and they urge regions to attend such to such vacancies occasioned by the redeployments. "The ANC PEC calls on all these deployees to neither spare their energy, capacity and resolve to attend to the service delivery challenges facing our people with the great sense of urgency. The PEC also expresses gratitude to all deployees who accepted and acted in various roles while awaiting the finalization of ANC processes," he said. Machaka said the

party is confident that the mayoral candidates are among the best in the ranks of the ANC, possessing substantial experience in local government and have ability to advance the mission of the organization to deliver essential services to the people. "The ANC PEC calls on all structures and communities to support them as they work towards building better municipalities that provide basic services to our people," he said.

The ANC in Limpopo has removed Maleke Mokganyetji as Executive Mayor of SDM.

BPSA to contest 2024 general election

MEC Lerule-Ramakhanya convinced that 2023 matric class will do better

MEC for Education in Limpopo, Mavhungu Lerule-Ramakhanya, said she is confident that the matric class of 2023 will do better than the previous cohort. The matric candidates commenced with their final yearly examination on Monday 30 October. Lerule-Ramakhanya said she is confident that this year's matriculants will produce good results as learners and educators in all grades got enough support since the beginning of the year to prepare them for year-end examinations. The intervention strategies included Saturday classes, Enrichment Camps and accountability sessions for poor performing schools and circuits. Limpopo has over 94 000 candidates registered to sit for final matric exams this year, with Vhembe East having the highest number of candidates followed by Capricorn South with Waterberg registering the lowest number of candidates. The MEC led the learner support programs in all the district municipalities in the province. The countdown to matric was held in Mopani East, 30 days before the start of the final exams to encourage candidates to do well. The Matric Final Push Programme was held in Lephalale at Mabalane Seleka Technical High School, 13 days ahead of the first paper. The final support activation was held in Vhembe West, Makhado EMPC where over 1000 learners from three circuits were part of the pledge signing. The signing of the pledge 9 days before the start of the examination was a reminder to candidates to abide by the examination laws and rules. The MEC has pleaded with parents to give maximum support to the candidates and must not burden them with domestic chores. Lerule-Ramakhanya pleaded with all stakeholders and the entire community to ensure that loud music, festivals and social gatherings are suppressed for the duration of the exams to give candidates ample time to study and focus. "The call is extended to Liquor outlets owners and taxi drivers to mute the sound in support of over 94 000 candidates and learners from the other grades who will also start with their exams in November," she said. The Democratic Alliance (DA) in Limpopo sent well wishes to matric candidates in the province. "We hope the Limpopo Department of Education has prepared our learners well and that we see a marked improvement from our National Senior Certificate (NSC) results from 2022, which were the lowest in the country. We acknowledge and commend the perseverance shown by our learners to reach this stage and write these exams despite the challenges facing Limpopo's education system such as limited support, overcrowded classrooms, dilapidated infrastructure, inappropriate and unsafe sanitation and challenges with the scholar transport and nutrition programmes," said Katlego Phala, DA Spokesperson on Education. Phala urged all learners to do their best while calling on parents to provide them with support and encouragement. "Obtaining a matric certificate is the stepping stone to a future filled with opportunity. The DA will keep a close eye on these exams by visiting schools in the province to assess the department's readiness," she said.

Public alert to be warned of 'bogus police officers'

The Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, has issued a stern warning to all shop owners and businesses in the province following reports of individuals falsely representing themselves as police officials. The warning comes after a recent incident that took place on Thursday 26 October in Tafelkop Mall under Motetema Policing Precinct when a group of suspects disguising as police officers, arrived at the mall premises driving in a white VW Polo Classic and flashing blue lights. "The armed suspects were allegedly dressed in full police uniform and instructed the security officers on duty to allow them access to the premises to conduct crime prevention duties and also monitor cameras at the control room. They then robbed the victims' cellphones, two-way radios and an official jacket. Police were alerted about the robbery but the suspects had already fled the scene. One SAPS reflector jacket was recovered from the scene," said Brigadier Hlulani Mashaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson. Mashaba said these imposters are not affiliated with law enforcement authorities and may attempt to gain access to business premises or request sensitive information. "The intensified high-density operations which also focus on counterfeit products, contraband and expired food sold at spaza shops and supermarkets, throughout the province, are executed by SAPS members derived from various police units such as Visible Policing, Detectives, Counterfeit and Contraband task teams," explained Mashaba. He indicated that bearing in mind that police officials attached to the detectives in the South African Police Service are working in normal private clothes and do not wear name tags, if shop owners have any suspicions, they have the right to ask official to identify himself or herself by showing off their appointment cards, which must be carried by each and every police official which executing their duties. Mashaba said anyone suspecting illegal activities at spaza shops or business premises can contact the Crime Stop Number on 08600 10111, the nearest police station or make use of MySAPSApp. General Hadebe has urged all shop owners to verify the credentials of anyone claiming to be a police officer and report any suspicious activity to the local police station immediately. "Your safety and security are our top priorities and we are actively investigating these incidents of criminals that are hell-bent on tarnishing the image of the police," Hadebe.

Sekhukhune District EMS Stations get 35 state-of-the art ambulances



has on Tuesday 7 November, handed-over over 35 brand-new ambulances to the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) at Sekhukhune District Municipality offices in Groblersdal. According to the provincial government, the state-of-the-art new fleet of EMS vehicles represented a major step in the department's ongoing commitment to enhancing healthcare services for all residents of the province. The hand-over is a pivotal moment aligning with the goal set by the MEC for Health in the province, Dr Phophi Ramathuba, during the 2023/2024 budget speech, to provide a total of 500 new ambulances. In recent months, 105 new ambulances have already been commissioned and allocated to EMS stations across the province. In addition, some districts and EMS stations are in the queue set to receive new ambulances in upcoming batches. During the hand-over, Premier Mathabatha was accompanied by MEC

of-art ambulances handed-over to various EMS stations in Sekhukhune. Ramathuba, Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr David Tladi, Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr Given Moimana and Acting Sekhukhune District Executive Mayor, Cllr Mohlala. Mathabatha emphasized the crucial role of ambulance services in delivering timely medical care to patients, ensuring immediate attention, providing vital first aid, stabilizing patients, and preventing the deterioration of their condition. "Improving our ability to respond

swiftly to emergency situations is our top priority. This is part of government's effort to fast

track emergency services and commitment of providing 500 new fleet in the 2023/2024 financial year. This year, we are presenting 565 ambulances," said Mathabatha. He said the new ambulances will play an important role in riding the backlog of shortage of medical vehicle and replace old ones that are currently in bad condition, delaying emergency services to Sekhukhune residents. "The plan is to acquire 50 ambulances every year and allocate them to various stations across the province. This is part of the commitment I was given by then President Jacob Zuma when I took reigns as premier in 2013," he said. Mathabatha said he is impressed with the way Ramathuba is erforming in ensur ing that the Health Department in the province serves the interests of Limpopo communities. "This ensures that lives of our residents are taken seriously. We appeal to the communities to take care of the ambulances and not damage the ambulances if protesting against

other services," he

said.

Public urged to be vigilant of car jamming during festive period

As the Festive Season is fast approaching, the Provincial Commissioner of Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, warns residents in the province to be cautious and vigilant to avoid falling victims of the crimes that include car jamming. Hadebe has warned motorists to be very cautious as thieves are utilising numerous jamming devices to break into vehicles. Car jammers are individuals using illegal devices to interfere with remote keyless entry systems, preventing vehicles from locking and securing properly. This poses a significant threat to the safety and security of motorists. "We strongly urge all members of the community to be vigilant and take precautions to protect their vehicles and their valuables from potential theft," she said. Hadebe shared safeguarding tips by urging motorists to manually check their vehicles after using their remote keyless entry, saying they always have to make sure their vehicles are locked by visually and manually inspecting the doors. She added that they will have to also use secondary security by considering using steering wheel locks or additional vehicle security systems to deter thieves. Hadebe advised motorists to be mindful of their surroundings when parking in public areas by choosing well-lit and busy locations when possible. "Report suspicious activity if you notice any suspicious behaviour or individuals tampering with vehicles, please contact the police immediately," stressed Hadebe. She appealed to the public to educate others by sharing the information with friends and family to raise awareness about car jammers. "We are actively engaged in various initiatives aimed at raising awareness to prevent any elements of criminality, especially during the festive season and if we receive cases emanating from car jamming, we assure the public that our dedicated members will ensure they are properly investigated and work diligently to apprehend those responsible," she said. The provincial commissioner said

the police are committed to ensuring the safety of communities and will continue to engage in efforts to prevent and combat car jamming. Hadebe has encouraged communities to stay informed and cooperate with the police to protect their neighbourhoods from this threat. She said members of the community are urged to report any crime related issues to the police on the Crime Stop Number, 08600 10111, the nearest police station or use MySAPSApp.

Two suspects accosted for robbery and possession of unlicensed firearm

Two suspects, aged 20 and 23 respectively, were arrested by Jane Furse Police for robbery and two counts of possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition at Ga-Mohlala in Mamone outside Jane Furse. The duo was nabbed on Tuesday 7 November 2023 at around 11h00 after the police received information about suspects that robbed a firearm from a security guard at the streets of Matsoke Section in Mamone. The suspects were handed to the police who effected an arrest immediately. During the search, the police recovered two firearms with ammunition. He said the suspects will appear before the Nebo Magistrate's Court soon, facing charges of robbery and possession of unlicensed firearm with ammunition. The Provincial Commissioner

of the Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, has commended the police for prompt reaction which led to the arrest of the suspects. She also praised the community members for taking charge of safety in their respective spaces.

Two security guards dies in Dennilton shooting spree

The Police in Dennilton are investigating two cases of murder, following shooting incident that took place at Malaeneng Village on Saturday 4 November 2023 at around 22h00. Brigadier Hlulani Mashaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said according to the information, on the day of the incident, a 29-year-old security guard, booked a firearm at work and went to a 40-year-old man who is his colleague from the same security company. "Upon arrival, he found only his wife, threatened her with firearm. The wife then told him that her husband attended a wedding at the same area, he then left. The woman then shouted for help and went to his neighbour and informed him. The neighbour took his firearm and followed the security guard. Allegedly, a security guard aged-29, shot at a 40-year-old man who is also a security guard. The neighbour, aged 66, who was informed by the wife of the 40-year-old victim, shot the security guard, aged 29," he said. Mashaba added that the police were alerted about the shooting incident and they arrived with emergency personnel and found two males lying in a pool of blood at the street with gun-shot wounds. "They were certified dead and identified as Chris Mahlangu (29) and Mpho Mothoveni (40). A 66-year-old male was arrested for murder and police opened two cases of murder for further investigation. The arrested suspect will appear before Moutse Magistrate's Court. Police investigations are still continuing," he said.

Masinakane Special School will finally get hostel

The Democratic Alliance (DA) in Mpumalanga said they are relieved that learners of Masinakane Special Needs School in Alemansdrift outside Siyabuswa, will finally receive the dignity they deserve after their intervention that saw the school getting attention of the Mpumalanga Department of Education to build proper hostel facilities. Teachers and learners of Masinakane, a school that caters for learners with disabilities, ranging from mild to severe and physical disabilities, have been struggling without decent hostel facilities since 2008. Learners at the school are currently sleeping in classrooms with no ablution facilities to be used at night. Jane Sithole, DA Spokesperson on Education in the province, said the party has been trying for years to bring to the attention of the provincial government, including Premier Refilwe Mtshweni-Tsipane and Education MEC Bonakele Majuba, the plight faced by the learners and teachers at this school. "But we were ignored until 2021 when we approached the South African Human Rights Commission (SAHRC) to intervene," she said. In a letter addressed by the DA to the SAHRC, the department of education committed that they would finalize planning and design for the hostel facilities in the 2024/2025 financial year. The department also mentioned that they are considering converting storerooms into toilets for the learners to use in the interim until the construction of the proper hostel facilities. "The DA welcomes the progress and positive development from the provincial government. We will continue the pressure to ensure that these learners are not forgotten or left behind," added Sithole. She said the party will never abandon the learners and teachers of Masinakane Special School. "We will walk with them hand in hand until all their challenges are taken seriously and addressed. We will continue engaging the provincial department of education constructively to address problems and challenges faced by

schools that accommodate learners with special needs in Mpumalanga, not just Masinakane Special School alone," concluded Sithole.
