




Dr. Esther Mahlangu crowned Lifetime Achievement Award winner

Renowned South African artist, Dr Esther Mahlangu, was honoured with the Lifetime Achievement Award during the Metro FM Music Awards gala event held at Mbombela on Saturday 6 May 2023. Mahlangu (87), from Weltevrede Village outside Siyabuswa, was handed the award by HOD for Mpumalanga Department of Sports, Arts and Culture, Godfrey Ntombela, during a star-studded gala evening that attracted thousands of attendees at the Mbombela Stadium. Mahlangu was named Lifetime Achievement Award winner alongside legendary Afro-pop Group, Mafikizolo. Mahlangu is a disruptor from an early age, becoming the first person to reimagine Ndebele design that is traditionally used for decorating cars and houses on contemporary mediums in an exotic and exceptional way over the past 30 years. In 1991, Mahlangu decorated a BMW 7 Series with the Ndebele inspired designs for which she has won global acclaim. She was the only South African artist invited to participate in 'Magiciens de la terre', curated by Jean-Hubert Martin in 1989 at Centre Pompidou and La Villette in Paris. Dr Mahlangu has spent more than 7 decades practising her art-form and has travelled extensively to collaborate with the world's most respected museums, galleries, curators, art fairs, celebrities and global brands. Highlights of the day during the largest South African music act included the announcement of winners per genres and categories of music. During the announcement, the late rap guru, Kiernan Jarryd Forbes (AKA), scooped Artist of the Year Award, Zuko SA became Best Afro-Soul Artist, Best Amapiano Song went to Deep London with Hamba and Limpopo based musician, Makadzi was announced as the Best Female Artist. Nada Wotshela, SABC Group Executive for Radio Nada Wotshela, said they were delighted with the success of the Metro FM Music Awards, which has cemented its place as the biggest and most prestigious music award ceremony on the South African entertainment calendar. "South Africa's music artists have overcome so much in the past five years and there was no better time to re-launch The Metro FM Music Awards than now. Metro FM is extremely proud and honoured to champion this important and high-profile event that recognises and celebrates diversity in music, art, fashion and culture," she said. She said that this year's awards were held in partnership with the Mpumalanga Provincial Government, which joined forces with Metro FM for the hosting of the 17th edition of the high-profile ceremony. "We are really excited to have partnered with the province for this year's Metro FM Music Awards. We are confident that this highly regarded event has benefited the music industry and promoted tourism in the province at the same time," she said.

Zenzele residents want solutions to their electricity wows

Residents of Zenzele Village in Dennilton, Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality Ward 7 said they are concerned over the long-standing problem of lack of electricity in the area, which dates back about two decades ago.

for the past twenty years. Zenzele residents blame the local municipality for failing to finalize negotiations with land owners to see basic services benefiting the community. About three years ago, an electrification project was started in the village and later halted by property owners who were demanding payment from Elias Motsoaledi Municipality before the project could be finalized. A community leader, Isaac Mkhaliphi, told the publication that it was frustrating to live in the dark for the past twenty years. "Living without electricity is a violation of our human rights. You can't do anything without electricity these days. Is a pity that we are still living in the olden days and relying on firewood, gas and paraffin stoves for cooking. It is very

difficult to live under these circumstances," he said. Mkhaliphi said they were hopeful that a meeting that was convened on Sunday 7 May 2023, between Elias Motsoaledi Municipality, land owners and community members will bear implacable solution. However, Elias Motsoaledi Town Planner, Boredi Sethojwa, told residents that the local municipality will be unable to pay a land fee demanded by property owners. "We were told only one land owner who occupies a little portion of land in the village will be paid. We were told the municipality will not be able to pay the two other property owners because they demand huge amount of money," he said. Mkhaliphi said residents are tired and some suggesting to stage protests to vent their frustrations. "It is in the light of this type of non-responsive nature of our local authorities that we saw communities resorting to go to the streets and vent their frustrations. However, we don't condone and justify violence and anarchy, but communities find it a brutal nature and anarchy of those who occupy public office that breeds the culture," he said. Mkhaliphi said residents

will seek ways to urge the local municipality to finalize talks with property owners, before resorting in spending millions of rands in a futile electricity project that has been on hold for the past three years. Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality Spokesperson, Simon Makua, said they decided to pay one property owner and could not afford to pay the two others as they demand the amount that exceeds the value of the land. Makua said the issue has been escalated to the Department of Cooperative Governance, Human Settlement and Traditional Affairs (Coghsta).





A multimillion rand security tender has caused ructions within the Sekhukhune district municipal council with opposition parties claiming the award process was dubious. Municipal manager Danger Madumane allegedly went against the council's recommendations in appointing a security company to guard the premises of four Sekhukhune district municipal sub-regions. The R270 million tender was awarded on 13 April. The council recommended four companies to be appointed to provide security services to these sites, but instead Madumane appointed one company. Madumane's action allegedly did not have the support of the entire municipal council, resulting in the opposition opening a case of corruption with the Hawks. Hawks spokesperson in Limpopo Lieutenant Colonel Matimba Maluleke confirmed the unit is investigating corruption allegations in the municipality. During an ordinary council sitting on 28 April this year, caucus leader for the opposition party, Seun Mogotji of the Bolsheviks, raised concerns about the awarding of the tender. "Mayor Maredi Moganyetji undertook to investigate this appointment. But Madumane went ahead and handed over a letter of appointment to a Nelspruitbased security company against a council resolution to investigate the appointment," Mogotji said. In a letter to the Sekhukhune municipal council and municipal manager Nancy Rampedi, Sigwavhulimu Attorneys ordered the municipality to rescind the appointment, claiming it was illegal. Council spokesperson Maredi Kgetjepe said Madumane was within his rights. But The Citizen can reveal that Treasury declined his request to deviate from the requirements of the tender. He could not

be reached for comment.

Massive manhunt launched for Ga-Rantho ATM bombers

The Police in Sekhukhune have activated a massive manhunt for a group of unknown heavily armed suspects who blasted an ABSA ATM at a Shell Garage in Ga-Rantho Village. According to the police report, the incident took place in the early hours of Thursday 4 May 2023. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said police preliminary investigation revealed that a group of unknown men armed with firearms entered the garage and started to shoot at a security guard before proceeding to the ATMs; set their explosives and blasted one of them and got away with an undisclosed amount of money. "The police were summoned to the scene and on arrival, the suspects, driving in a white Toyota Legend 45 and blue VW Polo noticed the police and started shooting at them. The police retaliated and a cross fire ensued. One of the suspects of about 35-years of age was shot and fatally wounded in the process while his accomplices managed to evade arrest," he said. Ledwaba said the police appeal to anyone with information that can assist in arresting the suspects involved in the incident to contact investigating officer, Lieutenant Colonel Tshinyadzo Ndou on 082 807 2666, crime stop number on 08600 10111, the nearest Police Station or make use of MySAPSApp. Ledwaba said the police investigations are still ongoing.

Over 20 000 child deaths recorded in Limpopo public health facilities

The Democratic Alliance (DA) in Limpopo said it has written a letter to MEC for Health in the province, Dr Phophi Ramathuba, to raise a concern about a high number of child deaths recorded during the last decade.

The party say they were shocked by a response on the Minister of Health DA parliamentary questions, which revealed that the province has recorded 24 744 child deaths in public health facilities over a ten year period, from 1 January 2013 to December 2022. The minister's report listed Limpopo as the fourth highest number of child deaths in a province,

with the most common causes of death: diarrhoea and pneumonia. DA Spokesperson for Health in Limpopo, Risham Maharaj, said the most common underlying causes of death in children are severe and moderate acute malnutrition, which could have been prevented by the Health Department. "Ramathuba and her department must provide clarity on a breakdown on the reasons for child deaths in the province, how many of the child deaths were due to unnatural causes, the most common causes of death and underlying causes of death in children in Limpopo, how many medical negligence claims the department faces as a result of child deaths, the nature of the claims and the potential cost to the department and the number of child deaths by public health facility," he said. Maharaj said the large number of deaths in children in the province is worrying and is evidence of a health system that is poorly managed, understaffed and under-resourced. "The DA is committed to ensuring adequate healthcare for children that ends preventable child deaths in Limpopo," he said. At the time of going to print, the Limpopo Department of Health was not available to respond if they have receive the letter from the DA.

Body fell out of coffin during funeral proceedings


The Mokwana family in Mmotwaneng Village outside Monsterlus, say they are going to take legal actions against a funeral parlour after a body fell out of a coffin.

This is after the bottom of the R15 000-00 casket inexplicably fallen out. The macabre incident occurred during funeral proceedings at the family home in the morning of Saturday 6 May. The family blame Somalakazi Funeral Services for delivering the deceased in the faulty coffin. The traumatic experience happened when the pallbearers carry the coffin to a local church for a service just before holding burial proceedings at the village's grave site. The incident left dozens of mourners terrified, with some saying that they decided never to attend funerals again after the shocking experience. The family had to stop the proceedings and wait for Somalakazi to deliver another coffin before they can bury their loved ones nearly three hours later. When contacted by the publication, the family was too upset to talk about the incident, saying it was painful and traumatic to bury their loved one after such shocking circumstances. Somalakazi Funeral Services owner, Sarah Mabuza, has apologised to the family saying the incident was unprecedented.

Mabuza has blamed the coffin manufacturer about the unfortunate incident experienced by the family during the funeral service.

Manhunt launched for fugitive who escaped from Hlogotlou Police custody

The Police in Hlogotlou outside Monsterlus have launched a massive manhunt for two male suspects who escaped from police custody on Thursday 4 May 2023. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, the suspects, Thabang Nzima (31) and Lewis Magoro (36), escaped from lawful custody at Hlogotlou Police Station holding cells at about 18:00. "One suspect, Sello Mankge, aged 29, was re-arrested in the station premises while trying to escape. Mankge allegedly committed robbery with aggravating circumstances and kidnapping that took place in Hlogotlou policing area in January 2022. Another fugitive, a 20-year-old Thabang Mokoena, who was amongst the four suspects who escaped from police cells was re-arrested on Sunday 7 May 2023. Mokowna was allegedly handed over to the police by a family member after they learned about his escape. He will be facing charges of robbery with aggravating circumstances and escaping from Lawful Custody," he said. Ledwaba added that Nzima is facing charges of rape that he committed in Motetema policing area in January 2019, while Magoro was nabbed for attempted murder and robbery charges that were committed in Motetema policing area in December 2022 and January 2023. "It is alleged that during the escape, the police were exchanging shifts when they discovered that the mash wire that protected the roof of the cells was cut out and four inmates were missing. They promptly launched a massive manhunt for the suspects, which led to the subsequent arrest of Mankge in the police station premises while the other three managed to escape," he said. Ledwaba said the other two suspects, Nzima and Magoro, are still at large and preliminary investigations indicated that the suspects were arrested for a series of crimes that were committed at different locations in the Sekhukhune District between 2019 and 2023 period. Ledwaba said Acting Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Limpopo, Major General Jan Scheepers, has activated all the appropriate resources for the immediate rearrests of the suspects and he is encouraging the members of the community to assist with their apprehension. "Anyone with information that can assist in locating the suspects is urged to contact the Investigating Officer, Sergeant Rocco Given Morgan on 072

114 1732, the crime stop number 08600 10111, the nearest police station or make use of MySAPSApp," he said. Ledwaba said police investigations are continuing.

The police in Siyabuswa are requesting community members to assist in reuniting 69-yearold Tshegane Sindane with his family. Sindane, who is residing at Maphotla Village, was last seen leaving home to fetch his cattle from the grazing field on Saturday 29 April 2023 at about 13:00. "By the time of his departure, he was wearing a pair of blue jeans, brown shoes, navy blue jacket and black cap. He is estimated at 1,59 metres tall and dark in complexion," said Brigadier Selvy Mohlala, Mpumalanga Provincial Police Spokesperson. Mohlala said the police appeal to anyone who might know the victim's whereabouts to contact Siyabuswa Police on 060 737 3254 or call the Crime Stop number at 08600 10111. "Alternatively, members of the



public can send information via MYSAPSAPP. All received information will be treated as confidential and callers may opt to remain anonymous," he said. Meanwhile the police in Lebowakgomo seek public assistance in locating a missing 67-year-old woman, Raesetje Tryphosa Mphahlele, from Seleteng Sefalaolo Ga-Mphahlele. According to Sergeant Tsietsi Lamola, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, before her disappearance, the granny was last seen on Friday 22 April 2023, at about 14:15 while at home. "Searches were conducted from relatives and places she frequently visits without any success," Lamola said. He said anyone with information that can assist to reunite Mphahlele with her family is requested contact the Investigating Officer, Lieutenant Colonel Nyamanyayo Thomas Baloyi on 082 565 8234, the nearest police station, alternative report to crime stop line on 08600 10111 or share the information on MysapsApp. Lamola said police investigations to locate the missing victim are continuing.

National Freedom Day celebrated in Tafelkop

Hundreds of people from various parts of Limpopo Province flocked to Tafelkop Stadium to commemorate the National Freedom Day on Thursday 27 April 2023. The event marked the 29th anniversary of South Africa's first democratic elections and celebrated under the theme: "Consolidating and Safeguarding Democratic Gains". Premier of Limpopo Province, Stanley Mathabatha, his Members of Executive Council (MECs), local traditional leadership, district and local mayors and other government senior officials attended the event. Delivering a keynote address, Mathabatha said the day was commemorated to honour the unsung heroes and heroines who fought for freedom and paved a way for an equal, representative and non-racial nation. "We are also here to increase an understanding of our history and development in democracy as well as celebrate South Africa's struggle icons. That is the reason why here in Limpopo, we honour heroes and heroines like Mohumagadi Madinoge, Ike Maphoto, Comrade Tambusa, Collins Chabane, Norman Mashabane, TT Cholo, Peter Mampogwane Nchabeleng, Peter Mokaba, Mme Lebea Mampuru, Mothupi Pharephare, Professor Muofhe, Jantjie Kabini, Ephraim Mogale, to name but a few," he said. Mathabatha added that the province was also remembering revolutionary banners who contributed towards freedom such as the 1958 Sebatakgomo Uprising, the fighters under the banner of Fetakgomo o Sware Motho, the 1976 Youth Uprising, the Sekhukhune Youth Congress detachment and the 1986 fighting forces. "We cannot forget the selfless sacrifice of the Rivonia Trialists, Rolihlahla Mandela, Walter Sisulu, Andrew Mlangeni, Ahmed Kathrada, Dennis Goldberg, Arthur Goldreich, Goven Mbeki," he said. Reflecting on progress made since the dawn of democracy, the premier said the province has made significant impact in fighting unemployment rate. "To date, the total number of employed persons in the province is now at 1, 337 million compared to 1, 184 000 million in 2021," he said. However, Mathabatha said they are very much concerned about millions of young people, aged 15 to 24, across the province who are not in employment, education or training. "It is in this context that government is working tirelessly with social partners and the private sector to resolve the challenge. On the other hand, will accelerate infrastructure development projects to achieve our mandate of industrialisation and job creation," committed Mathabatha. He said the Limpopo Provincial Government has also reduced the percentage of people living in poverty, achieving 51% of their 20% target they had previously set based on the Socio Economic Review and Overview of 2022. "Regarding access to basic services like water, 69% of the people in Limpopo are having access to clean and portable water. In this regard, government is working very hard to move to 100 per cent access. On electricity provisioning, we are pleased to report that 97.2 per cent of people living in Limpopo, have access to electricity," informed Mathabatha. He said the Limpopo Government had successfully implemented agricultural revitalization programmes to ensure food security, along with primary, secondary and tertiary health care system provided for free to all patients in the province. In addition, Mathabatha said the mining sector in Sekhukhune and other parts of the province continues to record significant progress with regard to employment of our young people in Limpopo. "Through all these programmes,

Ephraim Mogale and nine other municipalities, namely, Fetakgomo Tubatse Local Municipality, Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality, Polokwane Municipality, Bela Bela Local Municipality, Musina Local Municipality, Collins Chabane Local Municipality, Modimolle-Mookgophong Local Municipality, Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality and Makhado Local Municipality, are all party to the MoA.
