Groblersdal drug dealers' bail application deferred

The bail hearing for five accused individuals linked to a significant drug trafficking operation was postponed by the Groblersdal Magistrates' Court following their appearance on Tuesday 13 August 2024. The accused, who faced various serious charges, include Gonzalez Jorge Partida (53), Gutierrez Lopez Alejandro (43), Roelof Botha (57), Melvin Khumalo (34) and Rodriguez Ruban Vidan (44). The charges laid against them include manufacturing and dealing drugs, contravening the Immigration Act and money laundering. While two of South African citizens, Botha and Khumalo are applying for bail, the other three Mexican nationals, Partida, Alejandro and Vidan, have abandoned their bail applications. The five were arrested on 19 July 2024 at a farm owned by one of the accused, Roelof Botha, in Loskop South Thaba e Monate, outside Groblersdal. During a police search, drugs with an estimated street value of R1 Billion were confiscated. During the arrests, the Hawks, the Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation, acted on intelligence regarding illegal activities at the farm, uncovering vast quantities of chemicals used for drug manufacturing along with a large clandestine laboratory. The police seized 408.95 kg of acetone and methamphetamine (crystal meth). During the proceedings, two photo albums depicting the laboratories was submitted to the court. One set of photo albums was taken by the investigating officer using his cellphone and the other set was taken by the police from Local Criminal Record Centre (LCRC). The matter was postponed to 20 August 2024 for further presentation of evidence. In the previous court proceedings, Botha claimed the accused were renting his farm but failed to produce a lease agreement with the Mexican nationals. Khumalo stated in his affidavit that he was merely performing his duties as a transporter, claiming he had been hired to deliver food and acetone. However, the investigating officer testified against granting bail, citing public outcry and the severe nature of the crimes. The accused will remain in custody until their next court appearance.



Help needed to reunite these missing persons with their families

The Police in Vaalbank outside Siyabuswa are requesting members of the public to help them unite Nkotopane Francinah Kekana (41), with her family from Allemansdrift Village in Vaalbank. Mpumalanga Provincial Police Spokesperson, Colonel Donald Mdhluli, said according to the information, Kekana was last seen on 30 October 2023 and was never located ever since. "During her disappearance, the victim left home when she was heading to her work place at a farm in Groblersdal. She has never returned home ever since," he said. Mdhluli said the police are urging anyone with information that may assist in finding the whereabouts of

to the missing woman to contact Vaalbank Police Station on 013-973 9108, the nearest police station, or call the Crime Stop number on 08600 10111. "Alternatively members of the community can send information via MySAPSApp. All information received will be treated as confidential and callers may opt to remain anonymous. An investigation to locate the victim is currently continuing," concluded Mdhluli. Meanwhile the Police in Nebo are appealing for community assistance in locating a missing person, Sebolai Shemas Masemola (29), also known as Musasa, from Vlak Village near Monsterlus.

Elderly woman's rape sparks widespread condemnation

The Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, has strongly condemned the rape of an elderly woman in Zaaiplaas Village near Monsterlus.

The 101-year-old woman was brutally assaulted and raped while sleeping at her home on Saturday 27 July 2024. Following the incident, a manhunt ensued and a 27-year-old suspect, Sifiso Mahlangu, was arrested in connection with the assault and rape of the elderly citizen. Mahlangu made his first appearance at the Zaaiplaas Periodical Court on Monday 29 July 2024 on charges of house breaking and rape. His case was postponed to Thursday 8 August 2024 for formal bail application, however, the court was unable to finalise the application and the matter was postponed to 15 August 2024. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said the incident allegedly took place at Zaaplaas New Stands Section about 05:00am. "Reports indicate that the 101-year-old victim was asleep when she was awakened by the suspect who tried to strangle her before he raped her. The suspect, who broke the window to gain entry, fled the scene after the incident," explained Ledwaba. He

said the police were notified and a manhunt

ensued where the suspect was identified and arrested at his home shortly after the incident. During his court appearance, dozens of angry residents, lead by the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF), converged at the court calling for the bail to be denied.

A community activist who is also EFF Chairperson in Zaaiplaas, Abram Mahlangu, said they attended the court to oppose the bail application because the community will not sleep peacefully if the bail is granted to the suspect. "He has caused harm to the elderly and the rest of the villagers. We want the law to prevail and justice be served for the elderly woman and the community," he said. Provincial commissioner Hadebe hailed the prompt arrest of the suspect, adding that the despicable act of violence against a vulnerable member of the community is met with the full force of their commitment to justice. "The rape of an elderly woman is not just a crime against an individual but a deeply disturbing assault on our society's values and sense of safety," said Hadebe.

The Minister of Justice and Constitutional Development, Thembi Simelane, has expressed her profound outrage and unequivocal condemnation of the appalling rape of the elderly woman. "This horrific crime is a stark indictment of our society, particularly during Women's Month, a time dedicated to honouring and celebrating the women of our nation. The suffering inflicted upon this respected member of our community is both reprehensible and heart-breaking," she said. Simelane emphasised the importance of caring for and listening to our elderly, stating: "Older persons possess valuable knowledge and wisdom that can greatly enhance our efforts to build a better life for all. They are entitled to all the rights enshrined in our constitution, especially the right to have their dignity respected."

She added that the protection and dignity of the elderly and vulnerable reflect the core values of the society, grounded in Ubuntu and it is therefore deeply disturbing when such heinous acts occur in the country.

Minister Simelane has called for the full prosecution of those who target most vulnerable citizens and urged all South Africans to unite in demonstrating compassionate care, particularly towards the vulnerable, as part of our collective effort to prevent and combat gender-based violence and femicide. The minister also commended the swift actions of the law enforcement officers in apprehending the suspect.

EMLM Mayor's Bursary Fund eases burden for disadvantaged families

The Mayor of Elias Motsoaledi Local Municipality (EMLM), Cllr David Tladi, said the EMLM Mayor's Bursary Programme has reached a milestone of been successfully sending 100 students, coming from low-income families to different South African higher education institutions throughout the first two years of this council's present mandate. The Mayor's Bursary Programme was designed a few years ago to assist deserving students from disadvantaged backgrounds, who struggle to access tertiary education due to financial challenges. According to the municipality, applications for the bursaries will be opening at the end of October 2024 and the municipality will communicate in due course on application criteria and requirements. Tladi said the initiative was inspired by the words of the late President of South Africa, Dr Nelson Mandela, stating: "Education is the great engine of personal development". "A child of agricultural workers can become the president of a large country, a daughter from a peasant family can become a doctor, and a miner's son can become the head of the mine via education. Individuals differ from each other based on how we use the resources we have, not on what they are assigned," he said. Mayor Tladi said the bursary programme continues to be a compelling narrative and serves as proof of the municipality's reputation for providing access high-quality education. "Presently, the Mayor's Bursary Programme has provided opportunity to a large number of young people who would have otherwise faced difficulties with registration costs to access institutions of higher learning," he said. Additionally, Tladi indicated that to absorb youth empowerment into the municipality's system, EMLM is currently uplifting a number of young people from Elias Motsoaledi through their experiential programmes. "Our municipality placed 20 young people in a 2 year internship programme with the assistance of SALGA. There are currently eight finance interns being advertised and 39 experiential learners in our system, to whom we provide valuable knowledge and work experience to aid them in their job search efforts," explained Tladi. The mayor said he believes that by exposing the youth to practical work environments, they are equipping them with the necessary practical skills which will ensure that they gain sufficient experience to be able to apply for, and obtain jobs anywhere.

Limpopo Provincial Police Operations yield positive results

The Limpopo Police High Density Operations, conducted for a week-long period across the province recently, has resulting in the arrest of 957 suspects, including over 400 undocumented individuals. According to Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police spokesperson, during the operations, which took place across the province between 29 July and 04 August 2024, the police officers in the province conducted raids on crime hotspots areas, successfully traced wanted suspects and conducted roadblocks and stop-and-search operations. "The arrested suspects face charges including murder, attempted murder, car-jacking, undocumented immigration, drug-related offenses, theft and robbery, assault and rape," explained

Ledwaba. He said the police further confiscated various types of drugs such as dagga, heroin and nyaope, counterfeit goods and suspected stolen properties among others. The Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, has praised all the role players who participated in the operations. Hadebe further appreciated the support and cooperation of the public and encouraged continued collaboration to combat crime. Meanwhile the Sekhukhune Police have on Monday 12 August, during 'Operation Vala Umgodi', apprehended five suspects in connection with illegal mining and contravention of immigration Act. The suspects were arrested by a law enforcement team comprising of members from various components and units of the police and the South African National Defence Force (SANDF). According to Colonel Ledwaba, the team conducted an intelligence driven operation that resulted in the apprehension of the five suspects, aged between 33 and 43, for illegal mining and contravention of Immigration Act. "The team approached the illegal mining site at Atok area and found the suspects still busy illegally mining chrome. The arrested suspects will appear before Sekhukhune Magisterial Court soon facing charges of illegal immigration and illegal mining of chrome," he said. Ledwaba added that during the arrests the police confiscated two drilling bits, a Jack hammer and a shovel. "The teams are hard at work in all the five districts of Limpopo Province to ensure that illegal mining of precious minerals and sand becomes the thing of the past in this province," he said. Once again, Provincial Commissioner Hadebe has applauded the team working on Operation Vala Umgodi for successes they are archiving in every operation that they are conducting on continuous basis.

Police launch relentless pursuit to catch elderly woman's killer

The police in Motetema are still on the hunt for unknown suspect following the murder of an elderly woman that occurred on Tuesday 30 July 2024. According to the police, the 70-year-old woman was fatally shot in the early hours of Tuesday 30 July 2024 at Tafelkop, Mgababa residential premises at about 06:00. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said the police were alerted about a murder incident in the area and rushed to the scene and upon arrival, they found a 70-year-old female victim lying inside the house with gunshot wounds on the forehead. "The members of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) were summoned for medical assistance but certified her dead on their arrival. The preliminary report indicated that an unknown male suspect entered the house through an opened door and suddenly shot the elderly woman before fleeing the scene on foot. The suspect was allegedly wearing a balaclava with hand gloves," explained Ledwaba. He said a manhunt for the suspect is still underway and the police request anyone with information that can assist to contact Colonel Malekopela Nkadimeng on 082 319 9602, or Captain Malekutu Phasha on 082 414 6465, the crime stop number on 08600 10111, the nearest police station or make use of MySAPSApp. Ledwaba said police investigations are still continuing.
