



Ramathuba elected new Premier of Limpopo

Members of the Limpopo Legislature, assembled at the Lebowakgomo Legislative Chamber on Friday 14 June 2024, have elected Dr Phophi Rmathuba as the new Premier of Limpopo Province. Ramathuba, who was MEC for Health in the previous administration, was among members of legislature who took an oath from Limpopo High Court Judge President, George Phatudi, who presided over the proceedings where members sworn during solemn affirmations to serve in government with honesty and integrity.

Presenting her acceptance speech, Ramathuba expressed her privilege to the ANC, members of the legislature and people of Limpopo for having faith and confidence to allowing her to lead the seventh democratic administration in the province. "I am more than humbled by your faith and the confidence you have shown in me as the first democratically elected female premier of this great province. Allow me to pay my gratitude to the esteemed leaders and members of this great movement, the ANC and the alliance partners who are here today to witness this historic occasion," she said.

The new premier committed to not take her new responsibility for granted but to work tirelessly to change lives of Limpopo people to the better. "I know it as a matter of fact, that my election today is not a personal feat, but a call to action. I shall always strive to exercise my responsibilities with one thing in mind, that the people of Limpopo and their needs must always come first. The word responsibility carries a dual, but complementary, meaning. In one sense it refers to the state of having a duty to deal with something. In another, it talks to the state of being accountable for something," informed Ramathuba.

She said part of her responsibility is to create an environment conducive to the economic growth of the in the province and the socio-economic advancement of people, tilted in favour of the most vulnerable groups. "We also have a responsibility to remain accountable to those who brought us into this chamber and into public office. As public representatives of the people of this province, we are also humbled by the unequivocal and solid voice of the citizens of Limpopo when they said Limpopo must once again be governed by the African National Congress. The people have indeed spoken. As the ANC, we accept your overwhelming mandate, conscious of the service delivery challenges that lie ahead, and again we dare not fail," said Premier Ramathuba.

She ensured Limpopo residents that the current administration will strive to create job opportunities for the jobless, accelerate the provision of houses for the homeless, above all, deliver water and electricity to the most needy in the vast farmlands and far-flung villages in the province. Dr Ramathuba encouraged the youth, particularly women, to get educated and actively be involved in the country's politics.

She applauded previous provincial administrations leaders, saying that have over the past 30 years, ensured that Limpopo is a better place to live in. "Today, about 97% of households are electrified, no less than 70% of households have access to water, 96% of learners are on School Nutrition Programme, we have increased Grade 12 pass rate to over 79.5 % and, more importantly built state-of-the-art schools, hospitals and other essential infrastructure such as roads and bridges across the province," she said.

In promoting more woman empowerment, members of the Legislature have elected Makoma Makhurupetja as the new Legislative Speaker of the province, and her Deputy, Portia Mamorobela. The Sekhukhune Dispatch - 28 June 2024 DA Limpopo apprehensive on new Limpopo **Executive Council**

The Democratic Alliance (DA) in Limpopo say they are not happy al Relations and Cooperation (DIRCO) for an irregular expenditure of that some of the new cabinet of Members of Executive Council (MECs), appointed by the new Premier of Limpopo Province Dr Phophi Ramathuba, had failed in their previous deployments in a province that has consistently under-performed at every level in the last five years.

DA Leader in Limpopo, Lindy Wilson said the party hoped that Premier Ramathuba would select a cabinet that was without skeletons in the closet and able to steer Limpopo around to address poor service delivery and the plight of the poor. According to Wilson, MEC for Cooperative Governance, Human Settlement and Traditional Affairs (COGHSTA), Basikopo Makuma, has been reappointed despite his failings. "Municipalities are dysfunctional, in severe financial distress, riddled with corruption and unable to provide services to their communities. Not one water service authority is delivering and the Human Rights Commission (HRC) has declared them in violation of the Water Act. The HRC report was clear that the MEC for COGH-STA was negligent in his oversight and monitoring of the water crisis in Limpopo," explained Wilson. She added that the appointment of Kgabo Mahoai as the MEC of Treasury is more concerning because the newly appointed MEC was axed by the Directorate of Internation-

R118 Million to obtain land in New York, which never materialised. "Mahoai has now been given the cookie jar of the province and will manage its finances. Clearly, he is an unsuitable candidate given his history," said Wilson. She said the party is also not happy with the reappointment of Florence Radzilani, as new MEC for Social Development, describing it as a red flag for the DA. "Radzilani was called out on the VBS heist in an ongoing investigation, but she is called upon to manage a critical portfolio with a large budget," she said. Wilson further said the party is not pleased with the appointment of new Health MEC, Dieketseng Mashego, stating that she is inexperienced to run this crucial department. "Health must be of primary concern. Hospitals and clinics are under resourced, under staffed and woefully illequipped to deal with the needs of poor communities but the premier has elected an MEC with no health background or experience," she said. Wilson said the party will be closely monitoring every portfolio at all times and hold every MEC to account for poor performance, financial management and inadequate service delivery. "While we support a spirit of co-operation, transparency and respect, we cannot sit by while the poor and vulnerable of our province are pushed aside for party or personal gain," concluded Wilson.



The DA in Limpopo is not certain about the appointment of MEC Dieketseng Mashego in the health portfolio in Limpopo, stating that the new MEC has no health background or any experience in the field.



Despite having been held accountable for irregular expenditure amounting to R118 Million during his tenure at DIRCO, Kgabo Mahoai was appointed as new MEC for Treasury in Limpopo Province.

"With every conclusion of elections comes different roles and new responsibilities for various leaders. The municipality said they will soon announce the process for filling the vacant positions to ensure the continued delivery of services to the community and further details regarding the transition will be communicated in due course.

Child rapist gets hefty jail term

A 31-year-old man was sentenced to an effective 20 years sentence by the Groblersdal Regional Court after he was convicted for the rape of a five-year-old minor girl child.

Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said the accused, who cannot be named to protect the identity of the victim, received the lengthy jail sentence on Thursday 13 June 2024. "The court heard that on 11 October 2022, the accused raped a five-year-old child, who

is his neighbour. The victim was playing in the streets with her friends when the accused gave her money (R1.00) to buy sweets. When the little girl returned, the same man gave her some more money. He thereafter grabbed her to a nearby abandoned house where he sexually violated her," explained Ledwaba.

He said the victim's mother was alerted by one of the kids that were playing with her that the accused left with her child. "She then followed them, and she caught him while busy with the ordeal. Upon noticing the victim's mother, he released the girl," Ledwaba said. He said the incident was reported to the police and a rape case was registered against the accused at the police station. "The docket was transferred to Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offenses Unit at Groblersdal, and it was investigated by Sergeant Thabitha Letladi. The suspect was traced and later arrested for rape," informed Ledwaba.

He said subsequent to trial appearances, the

accused was sentenced to direct 20 years in prison, declared unfit to possess a firearm and he will be registered on national sexual offenders register.

Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, Limpopo Provincial Police Commissioner, has welcomed the conviction and sentencing by the court and further praised the investigating officer, the arresting team, prosecutions and all involved for removing this perpetrator within the community.

Elandskraal man nabbed with unlawful high calibre rifle

The Police in Elandskraal outside Marble Hall have on Thursday 13 June arrested a 33-yearold man for possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said the police were summoned to the scene at Tsantabela Village whereby two groups of family members were involved in a heated argument. "Upon arrival, the police approached the group and led them to the Elandskraal Police Station for further interrogation. While at the police station, the police searched all the occupants who were driving in two vehicles, charcoal Ford Ranger double cab and white Hundai H1 minibus. During the search, one of the group was found in possession of an unlicensed AK47 rifle and 27 live ammunition. The suspect was immediately arrested for possession of unlicensed firearm and ammunition," explained Ledwaba. He said circumstances that led to the two families to engage in a heated argument are still under investigation and the arrested man will appear before Marble Hall Magistrate's Court after further police investigations. Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Limpopo, has applauded the police members for arresting the suspect and recovering the unlicensed firearm. "We praise the team for being vigilant when performing their duties and responding quickly to the situation," said Hadebe.

Massive manhunt activated for Philadelphia Road armed robbery suspects

The Police in Dennilton have launched a massive manhunt for a group of unknown suspects who robbed two employees, who were selling meat, of an undisclosed amount of money along the Moteti-Philadelphia Road. According to the police report, the armed robbery was committed on Friday 21 June 2024 at about 13:30. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said police preliminary investigations revealed that the two employees of a company selling meat were driving in a company vehicle when a white BMW overtook their vehicle and barricaded the road, restricting the movement of their vehicle. "The suspects, armed with firearms, alighted from the BMW and they pointed victims with firearms and instructed the driver and his colleague to drive towards Moteti Road. The victims obliged and the suspects stopped them and demanded money. The suspects searched them and made off with an undisclosed amount of money and the car keys belonging to the victims' vehicle," explained Ledwaba. He said the police were alerted about the incident and a case of armed robbery was opened at Dennilton Police Station. "The suspects are still at large and anyone with information that can lead to their arrest should contact Constable Andrew Nkgodi on 076 628 6701, or the Crime Stop Number on 08600 10111, the nearest police station or make use of MySAPSApp. Police investigations continue." he said.



During the summit, attending stakeholders discussed the future of agriculture in Ephraim Mogale with key attendees included EPMLM Mayor Cllr Given Moimana, EPMLM Council Speaker Cllr Rebecca Lentsoane, Chief Whip of EPMLM Council Lina Magane and several other council members and officials. Other stakeholders included Department of Rural Development, UCanGrow Africa, NYDA, LEDA, Small Enterprises Development Agency, Sekhukhune Development Agency, Red Meat Industry Services, Agri-Limpopo, AFASA, National Movement of Rural Women, FNB, Piet Engelbrecht Trust and commercial farmers from Marble Hall and Elias Motsoaledi respectively. The summit discussed funding for emerging farmers, public/private partnerships, agro-processing, and the creation of an agricultural master plan to achieve the municipality's vision of becoming a 'world-class agricultural hub'. FNB has in the summit, committed to providing funds for emerging farmers, and commercial farmers, offered experiential learning and incubation programs. LDARD committed to farmers that they will help with access to water and land, while the local municipality committed that they will provide farming spaces through the Local Economic Development (LED) department. Projects earmarked to be supported include a 35 hectare center pivot and 40 hectare sprinkler irrigation in Mogalatsane, Mashasha Farm animal handling facilities, Cooltton Farmers: Ploughing and planting 350 hectares with seeds, fertilizers, and chemicals for cotton farmers. The private partnership support includes peace table grape project for Schoonbee Farm at Moganyaka, support for Kopanong citrus and Mogalatsane irrigation scheme at Piet Engelbrecht Trust Farm and support for Jan Terblanche Irrigation Scheme in Dichoeung. "This diverse gathering is dedicated to setting a new economic growth path to enrich our agricultural landscape, transfer skills, implement agro-processing, and provide funding to our emerging farmers to tackle poverty, unemployment, and inequality," said Mayor Moimana.

"The only challenge we are facing now is lack of interest and participation from young girls. However, there are some who come on board, but the number is not satisfactory. We call upon to parents and women who may have interest in joining the team to come forward," he said. Maelane has called for interested boys and girls from Mmakgatle and surrounding villages such as Hlopha, Ngwalemong, Serithing, Mabitsi, Lukau and Legolaneng not to hesitate and come to join the football club free of charge. "We are
