Four murder suspects arrested near Marble Hall and Jane Furse

The Police in Limpopo have made a major breakthrough in arresting four suspects involved in the heinous house robbery that resulted in the murder and kidnapping of a 38-year-old man on 13 March 2024 in Monsterlus in Hlogotlou policing area, Sekhukhune District. The four suspects aged 23 and 53 were arrested on Thursday, 16 May 2024, following an extensive intelligence

driven joint operation comprising members of murder and robbery and detectives. Two of the suspects aged 23 and 35, of which one is a foreign national, were arrested at Marble Hall informal settlement. During the arrest, police recovered some of the items that were taken from the victims during the house robbery. The other two suspects aged 40 and 54, including the female victim's estranged in Jane Furse policing area. One suspect was found in possession of an unlicensed firearm, believed to have been used to commit the crime. The Provincial Commissioner of Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe has welcomed the arrests. "The tireless work of our officers in bringing these perpetrators to justice is commendable.

husband, were arrested in Matekane village These arrests will send a stern warning to criminals that no lawlessness will be allowed to take hold," stated Lieutenant General Hadebe. The four suspects will soon appear before Nebo Magistrate's Court facing charges ranging from murder, kidnapping, house robbery, possession of unlicensed firearm, and possession of suspected stolen properties. Police investigation continues.



Nine arrested following Rakgoadi taxi violence

The police in Motetema have arrested nine suspects in connection with a taxi violence that erupted in the Rakgoadi area. The suspects, aged between 27 and 44, were arrested following multiple violent incidents that took place on 13 May 2024 at the Rakgoadi Taxi Rank in Makgatle, Rakgoadi Police Station, and Makgatle Sport Ground between 09:30 and 15:00. They were identified as Irvin Motaung (44), Jim Marota (32), Branden Ditsepu (27), Collin Masemola (33), Khimotso Manaswe (38), Elias Mashego (28), Mbuyiseni Nkosi (28), Paris Mokalapa (31) and Mphethi Collen (42). They made their first appearance before the Motetema Periodical Court on Monday 20 May 2024 facing charges including public violence, malicious damage to property, and assault GBH and were remanded in custody for profiling of bail applications. Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpop Provincial Police Spokesperson, said according to reports, the accused targeted the Tsimanyane Taxi Rank in Makgatle Village, where they vandalized the wheel and tires of a quantum and a patrol vehicle. "Subsequently, they moved to the Rakgoadi Taxi Rank where they damaged tires of taxis, smashed and broke the windscreen of a parked van, caused extensive damage to a blue patrol vehicle and assaulted the driver," explained Ledwaba. He said the accused then proceeded to Rakgoadi Police Station where they vandalized the windscreens of two Toyota Quantum minibus taxis parked at the gate. "Following the incidents, the suspects went to the Makgatle Sport Grounds where they inflicted damage on another patrol vehicle and overturned it. The police swiftly responded to the incidents, registering cases and launching a comprehensive search operation. Through dedicated investigative efforts, a team of officers managed to apprehend all nine involved," Ledwaba said. Provincial Commissioner of the Police in Limpopo, Lieutenant General Thembi Hadebe, commended the prompt action taken by the police members. Hadebe further condemned the taxi violence incidents and encouraged taxi associations to avoid engaging in violence when facing challenges. "Acts of public violence, malicious damage to property, and assault, are grave offenses and will not be condoned in our communities. We urge the taxi associations to collaborate with the police in preventing and combating such criminal behaviours," said Hadebe.



No service delivery for Mabitsi residents

Residents of Mabitsi Village outside Marble Hall in Ephraim Mogale Local Municipality (EPMLM) say they are fed up with poor service delivery that include poor standard of roads and shortage of water provision. Residents blame EPMLM for failing to upgrade the state of their gravel roads which includes the only main road that links the village with neighbouring places. They say they have been tormented by a serious water shortages that started hitting the area five years ago. The villagers say for many years they have raised their poor service delivery plight with both EPMLM and Sekhukhune District Municipality (SDM) and were given the cold shoulder. Residents say the poor state of D4328 has been an eyesore which has been a nightmare for motorists. The D4328 is a main road connecting Mabitsi with other villages such as Mohlalaotoane, Moeding, Ngwalemong, Mmakgatle, Vaalbank and Ga-Hlopha. To vent their anger about the poor condition of the road, on 11 January 2023, Mabitsi community staged a total shutdown to complain. They were demanding the Limpopo Department of Roads and Infrastructure to come and address their poor roads standard concerns. The protest was halted after MEC for Roads and Infrastructure in Limpopo, Nkakareng Rakgoale, engaged with the demonstrating communities. Rakgoale committed that the road will be upgraded during the 2023/2024 financial year, however the road project was never implemented. Kali Maelane, who is a community leader in Mabitsi and Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) PR Councillor in EPMLM, said they have been raising poor service delivery concerns and have waited for unfulfilled promises. "It is now long overdue and we are tired of waiting," he said. To add to their woes, Maelane said MEC Rakgoale promised that the road project will be completed in a 12 month period, however, no construction has taken place until now. "This is frustrating because the main road is full of dongas and inaccessible, especially during the rain. The road condition also delays emergency vehicle services such as ambulances and police," informed Maelane. He added they are also facing a serious struggle of water with the community urged to fetch drinking water from the nearest rivers and wells. "We are living without water for the past five years and we were told by Sekhukhune District Municipality that a pipe has been damaged at Vaalbank. We are worried that the pipe was never fixed for so many years. This is one of government's empty promises that badly affect our community," he said. Maelane said residents are fed up and suggesting to stage another protest to raise their concerns. However, community leaders advised that they will be demanding authorities to provide basic services to the village in a peaceful manner. Public Works Department Spokesperson, Danny Legodi the department is aware of the delay of the D4328 Road upgrade, however, they are finalising the design stage. "The designs are now being assessed for environmental authorisation. The project team is in constant engagement with the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE) to facilitate the authorisation of borrow-pits. This is an important step that has to be compliant with the laws of the country," explained Legodi. He said the total costs of the project will follow after the finalisation stage of the designs. "The Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure together with Roads Agency Limpopo, are committed to afford the process all the attention it deserves and ensure that adequate time is allowed for these critical steps to be implemented to achieve the best quality Road for the communities," he said. SDM Spokesperson, Lemson Moropjane, could not respond to WhatsApp messages sent by the publication when requesting a comment.

Groblersdal Police probe rape of 15-year-old girl

The Groblersdal FCS Police Detectives are investigating a case of rape after a 15-year-old girl was raped at the Nebo Policing Precinct in Mathusand Section, Glen Cowie Village on Saturday 18 May around 19:00. According to Colonel Malesela Ledwaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, the police received information that the victim was coming from a local wedding ceremony walking to her residence when an unknown man approached from her behind at Matsumane Sport Grounds. "The suspect came running and he apparently grabbed the victim on the neck and threatened to kill her. He pushed her on the ground, undressed her, and raped her. Thereafter, fled from the scene," explained Ledwaba. He said the victim reported the incident to her mother and she was immediately taken to local hospital for medical treatment. Ledwaba added that the police were informed about the incident and a case of rape was opened at Nebo Police Station. "The docket was later transferred to Groblersdal Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offences Unit of investigations," he said. Ledwaba said the police appeal to anyone with information regarding the incident to contact the investigating officer, Warrant Officer Mahuleng Thoka on 072 679 6553, the Crime Stop Number on 08600 10111, the nearest police station or to make use of MySAPSApp.

High-density Operation Vala Umgodi pays off once again

The joint operational multi-disciplinary forces comprising of the SAPS Tactical Response Team, National Intervention Unit, Public Order Police, Organised Crime Investigation, K9 Unit, Border Police Team along with the SANDF as well as the Department of Home Affairs have recovered five tipper trucks and millions of rands worth of illicit cigarettes through high-density Operation Vala Umgodi. It is reported that the Team in Sekhukhune District, Limpopo, has in the early hours of Monday 27 May 2024, accosted five tipper trucks and a Toyota Hilux double cab along R555 road outside Burgersfort loaded with chrome, suspected of being stolen. Preliminary investigations revealed that the chrome was taken from illegal mining sites. The Police have arrested the five males drivers of the trucks aged between 36 and 66 for possession of suspected stolen precious minerals while the sixth unknown male suspect fled the scene on foot.

The suspects are expected to appear before various Magistrate's Courts in the week.

The tragic incident occurred in Elansdoom village on Monday, 27 May 2024 at about 06:00, where a heated argument between the couple escalated, leading to the wife shooting her husband. According to the preliminary information, the violence ensued after the suspect found out about her husband's infidelity which was taking place on the same rental premises. She then fetched her husband's licensed firearm and started firing several shots at him while he was trying to escape. Unfortunately, the 32-year-old victim was shot and he collapsed on the street. Matlerekeng Police sought four unknown armed robbery suspects

The police in Matlerekeng outside Marble Hall are searching for four unknown suspects in connection with an armed robbery incident that took place on Wednesday, 22 May 2024 at Ga-Matlala Ramoshebo Village in Moutse West. Brigadier Hlulani Mashaba, Limpopo Provincial Police Spokesperson, said the armed robbery occurred when a 40-year-old Pakistani national, who was accompanied by his employee, was allegedly attacked while driving a white Toyota bakkie when a blue Kia motor vehicle, without registration number overtook and stopped in front of them along Ga-Matlala Ramoshebo Village road. "Suddenly, one suspect vacated the motor vehicle and produced a firearm that was pointed at the duo. Moreover, three male suspects also came out of the Kia motor vehicle and demanded money and cellphones from the victims," said Mashaba. He added that during the robbery incident, the two male victims were subsequently dispossessed two cellphones valued at R2000-00 and a substantial amount of cash that was intended to purchase stock for two retail stores that belonged to a 40-year-old Pakistan national. "Afterward, the four suspects managed to flee the scene driving in a blue Kia motor vehicle. A manhunt of the four suspects is underway and anyone with information that can assist with the investigations, should contact the Investigating Officer, Sergeant Gezani Hlongwane on 064 756 8009, the Crime Stop Number on 08600 10111, the nearest police station or make use of MySAPSApp. Police investigations are continuing," concluded Mashaba.

SDM warns of tender scammer targeting potential service providers

The Sekhukhune District Municipality (SDM) is alerting all communities and potential service providers about scammer who impersonate to be senior municipal officials, with aims to solicit money from unsuspecting service providers doing business with the municipality. According to the district municipality, the fraudulent activities are involving an individual named Isaak Kgwale, with contact number 060 875 9786, who is falsely claiming to be the SDM Municipal Manager, Meshack Kgwale. "The said Isaak Kgwale has been reported to request money or financial assistance from service providers in exchange for awarding tenders. Please be advised that these actions are fraudulent and not sanctioned by the municipality," said SDM Spokesperson Lemson Moropjane. He said the municipality does not solicit any form of payment or financial assistance from service providers for the awarding of tenders. "All tender processes are conducted in a transparent and fair manner, in accordance with our official procurement procedures. If you are approached by Isaak Kgwale or anyone else requesting money in exchange for tenders, please do not comply and report the incident immediately to the municipality's fraud hotline on 0800 212 212," he said.
